THE NEED FOR A CRISIS TEAM

All we have to do is read the headlines or watch the news to see how schools are affected by traumatic events. Events such as violent incidents, car accidents, suicides and the death of a student or faculty member affect the entire school community. When such events occur, schools often need additional support and specialized services.

All schools have their own crisis plan, however, the challenge is often having enough trained and qualified people to meet the need. It can be difficult for one or two counselors to handle the counseling needs of an entire school community when a student dies in a car accident, or a teacher dies of a sudden heart attack. The task is overwhelming. School crisis teams trained through Cornerstone of Hope have assisted schools and responded to 45 crisis calls.
