

## Resolution in Support of the Utah Republican Party's Nominating Process

**Whereas**, Article I Section 1 of the Utah Constitution guarantees to us the inherent and inalienable right to assemble peaceably, and to communicate freely our thoughts and opinions; and,

**Whereas**, Article I Section 2 of the Utah Constitution declares that all political power is inherent in the people; and,

**Whereas**, Amendments 1, 9, and 10 of the U.S. Constitution protect our (non-enumerated) God-given right of association; and,

**Whereas**, the Utah Republican Party is a private organization with authority to govern itself (the right of self-determination); and,

**Whereas**, the Utah Republican Party has--for most of its history--selected its nominees via delegates chosen in precinct caucuses; and,

**Whereas**, the Utah Legislature in 2014 usurped the party's nominee-selection process with the passage of Senate Bill 54, and foisted a signature-gathering process upon the party; and,

**Whereas**, the signature-gathering process encroaches on the party's right to select its nominees as it chooses, favors candidates with money and name recognition, and bypasses candidate-delegate interaction (which interaction helps to keep public servants close to the people);

**THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Utah Republican Party will support nominees chosen by its grassroots delegates, and not support other candidates.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that Republican legislators are strongly encouraged to pass legislation in the 2024 General Session that restores the party's authority to choose its nominees as it sees fit.
