First Reading: Jonah 3:1-5, 10

The word of the LORD came to Jonah a second time, saying, "Get up, go to Nineveh, that great city, and proclaim to it the message that I tell you." So Jonah set out and went to Nineveh, according to the word of the LORD. Now Nineveh was an exceedingly large city, a three days' walk across. Jonah began to go into the city, going a day's walk. And he cried out, "Forty days more, and Nineveh shall be overthrown!" And the people of Nineveh believed God; they proclaimed a fast, and everyone, great and small, put on sackcloth.

When God saw what they did, how they turned from their evil ways, God changed his mind about the calamity that he had said he would bring upon them; and he did not do it.

THE NICENE CREED (Please Stand as You Are Able)

Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself, and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all.

He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself, in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me." Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:

We celebrate the memorial of our redemption, O Father, in this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving. Recalling his death, resurrection, and ascension, we offer you these gifts. Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son, the holy food and drink of new and unending life in him. Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom. All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ: By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. *AMEN.*

And now, as our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to say, *THE LORD'S PRAYER*

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. BOB'S MUSIC NOTES

"O Bless the Lord" is a paraphrase of Ps. 103 by James Montgomery, newspaper publisher and author of "Angels From the Realms" and nine other hymns in our book. The tune was written by a Welsh music teacher and engraver, Aaron Willians, who named his melody "St. Thomas" - but there was already an unrelated "St. Thomas" so he added his name in parentheses.

"There's A Wideness" was authored by Faber, who was a Calvinist but came under the influence of Cardinal Newman and embraced Catholicism. But his earlier religious experience gave him a love of hymns which he encouraged in his new faith. His best-known work is "Faith of Our Fathers." John Zundel wrote the music. He was born and died in Germany, but was organist in Brooklyn NY between those dates at Plymouth Church, pastored by the brother of Harriet Beecher Stowe, Henry Ward Beecher - very popular in his day. Zundel named his tune after the pastor.

"Christ for the World" was the work of a Congregationalist minister, missionary, and hymn writer, Samuel Wolcott. The tune "Moscow" is used three times in our book and named for its composer who was living in Russia at the time.

The late beloved musician Natalie Allyn Wakeley Sleeth wrote both words and music of our anthem, based on Jesus' appearance after the Resurrection when he told his disciples to "feed my lambs."


