Bob's Music Notes

"Poeme" is by Thewes who had a lengthy music ministry at Westbrook Park UMC and who, along with Keven Kutz, is now responsible for music at all three RC Massillon churches. Mark dedicated this piece to my late wife Kathleen. It features the English Horn stop contrasted with flute.



"Holy Father, Great Creator" was authored by Massachusetts Bishop

Griswold. Each stanza addresses a person of the Trinity. Composer Smart was an Englishman remembered best for this tune "Regent Square." He was also skilled as a mechanic in organ building. Preacher Harry Emerson Fosdick so loved this tune he wanted his "God of Grace" to be sung to it and was horrified to find his text wedded to Cwm Rhondda!

"Eternal Father," also known as the Navy Hymn, was sung at every Naval Academy service when my son was there, intoned very slowly and movingly. Writer Whiting, British Anglican, grew up near the ocean and experienced a terrifying sea voyage which led to this text. He based it on Psalm 107 "Others there are who go down to the sea in ships...." Composer Dykes wrote some 300 hymn tunes which are still in use today. He named this one "Melita" after the shipwreck described in Acts where Paul was cast ashore at Malta.

"Lead Us, Heavenly Father" was written by eminent British architect and hymnwriter Edmeston. With over 3000 texts to his credit, he would write a new hymn every Sunday. I don't remember us ever using this hymn before, and it's a shame - great text and such a scale-wise tune from a 1782 book harmonized by Monk, best known for "Abide With Me."
