Since all these things are to be dissolved in this way, what sort of persons ought you to be in leading lives of holiness and godliness, waiting for and hastening the coming of the day of God, because of which the heavens will be set ablaze and dissolved, and the elements will melt with fire? But, in accordance with his promise, we wait for new heavens and a new earth, where righteousness is at home.

Therefore, beloved, while you are waiting for these things, strive to be found by him at peace, without spot or blemish; and regard the patience of our Lord as salvation.

Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself, and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all.

BOB'S MUSIC NOTES

"Blessed be..." were uttered by the father of John the Baptist as he beheld the divine infant. Beloved English divine Michael Perry wrote the text based on the Song of Zechariah which we know as the "Benedictus." Perry wrote some 300 hymns, the most famous of which is "Calypso Carol," for which he wrote both words and music. We may sing it later this month. Basil Harwood has three of his musical settings in our book. This is the first time we've used this hymn. Don't let its unfamiliarity discourage you.

"Prepare the Way" boasts an engaging Advent text, Scandinavian throughout with words by Finnish Bishop Franzen and a rather jolly folk tune from Sweden.

"On Jordan's Bank" is a "must" for any Advent service. Author Coffin (b. 1676) was Rector at the University of Paris and upheld the faith despite criticism. He is not to be confused with Wm. Sloane

Coffin, chaplain at Yale and minister of the Riverside Church. "Winchester New" started life in 1690 and has been harmonized by Monk, famed for "Abide With Me."

The choral selection is by black Catholic composer James Moore Jr who served as a music professor in Ohio for 5 years and then spent the rest of his life as a musician in Vienna. His most famous work is "Taste and See" which we have sung.

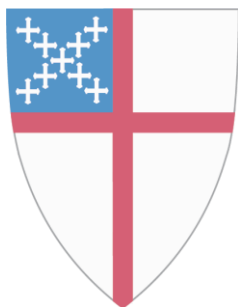
