In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, asking, "Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews? For we observed his star at its rising, and have come to pay him homage." When King Herod heard this, he was frightened, and all Jerusalem with him; and calling together all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Messiah was to be born. They told him, "In Bethlehem of Judea; for so it has been written by the prophet:

`And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for from you shall come a ruler who is to shepherd my people Israel.'"

Then Herod secretly called for the wise men and learned from them the exact time when the star had appeared. Then he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, "Go and search diligently for the child; and when you have found him, bring me word so that I may also go and pay him homage." When they had heard the king, they set out; and there, ahead of them, went the star that they had seen at its rising, until it stopped over the place where the child was. Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself, and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all.

#### **Bob's Music Notes**

"Angels From the Realms" is the best-known work of Scottish poet James Montgomery with the tune Regent Square, also the best-known work of British organist Henry Smart. Preacher Fosdick ("God of Grace and God of Glory") wanted this tune for his text and when the 1935 Methodist Hymnal published it with Cwm Rhondda he was outraged.



"What Star Is This?" was authored by Coffin, b. 1676, rector of the University of Paris and translated by Anglican Chandler. The attractive tune comes from the 15th C.

"'Earth Has Many A Noble City" started life in 405 AD with Prudentius, a Roman governor with a translation by Caswall who converted to Roman Catholicism under the influence of Cardinal Newman. "Stuttgart" is all quarter notes - moves along quickly - with only two half notes to break the pattern.

Anthem writer Harold Heath Jr is a free-lance British author whose poem speaks of a Holy Vision present at significant seasons of the year such as Christmas and Epiphany with music by Jane Manton Mashall, much-honored composer and music theory teacher at SMU, recently deceased at age 94. Her 1957 anthem "Awake, My Heart" won an AGO prize and was a pioneer in employing a jazz flavor.

Ken's solo was written by Minnie Haskins in 1908. Future Queen Elizabeth II at age 13 found the poem and gave it to her father who read it to the UK in a 1939 radio address which assured its popularity.
