Bob's Music Notes

Since last Sunday was Reformation Sunday, we sing Luther's "Battle Hymn." He wrote the melody and text; Bach wrote the harmony which has inspired composers of all stripes.

Eric Thiman ("tea-man") was a prolific British composer - some 3100 works in print, and professor at the Royal Academy and University of London.



"Praise to the Living God" comes from medieval Jewish Liturgy translated by Rabbi Landsberg and Unitarian pastor Newton Mann. The stately tune was the work of a cantor at London's Great Synagogue who later moved to Jamaica. This tune is also used with "The God of Abraham Praise."

"Rise Up, Ye Saints of God" was authored by Pierson (d.1954), pastor of the famous Brick Presbyterian Church in NYC (also pastored by Henry VanDyke, who presided there at Mark Twain's funeral). Andrew Carnegie said that Pierson's sermon on "peace" was the greatest pulpit utterance he had ever heard. "Festal Song" was composed by William Walter, organist of the Old Trinity Church in Manhattan, who has some 43 hymn tunes to his credit.
