FIRST READING:..... Joshua 24:1-2a,14-18

Joshua gathered all the tribes of Israel to Shechem, and summoned the elders, the heads, the judges, and the officers of Israel; and they presented themselves before God. And Joshua said to all the people, "Thus says the LORD, the God of Israel:

"Now therefore revere the LORD, and serve him in sincerity and in faithfulness; put away the gods that your ancestors served beyond the River and in Egypt, and serve the LORD. Now if you are unwilling to serve the LORD, choose this day whom you will serve, whether the gods your ancestors served in the region beyond the River or the gods of the Amorites in whose land you are living; but as for me and my household, we will serve the LORD."

Then the people answered, "Far be it from us that we should forsake the LORD to serve other gods; for it is the LORD our God who brought us and our ancestors up from the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery, and who did those great signs in our sight. He protected us along all the way that we went, and among all the peoples through whom we passed; and the LORD drove out before us all the peoples, the Amorites who lived in the land. Therefore we also will serve the LORD, for he is our God."

SECOND READING Ephesians 6:10-20

Be strong in the Lord and in the strength of his power. Put on the whole armor of God, so that you may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil. For our struggle is not against enemies of blood and flesh, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers of this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places. Therefore take up the whole armor of God, so that you may be able to withstand on that evil day, and having done everything, to stand firm. Stand therefore, and fasten the belt of truth around your waist, and put on the breastplate of righteousness. As shoes for your feet put on whatever will make you ready to proclaim the gospel of peace. With all of these, take the shield of faith, with which you will be able to quench all the flaming arrows of the evil one. Take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God.

Pray in the Spirit at all times in every prayer and supplication. To that end keep alert and always persevere in supplication for all the saints. Pray also for me, so that when I speak, a message may be given to me to make known with boldness the mystery of the gospel, for which I am an ambassador in chains. Pray that I may declare it boldly, as I must speak.

GOSPEL: *John 6:56-69*

Celebrant: The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John

Response: *Glory to you, Lord Christ.*

Jesus said, “Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood abide in me, and I in them. Just as the living Father sent me, and I live because of the Father, so whoever eats me will live because of me. This is the bread that came down from heaven, not like that which your ancestors ate, and they died. But the one who eats this bread will live forever.” He said these things while he was teaching in the synagogue at Capernaum.

When many of his disciples heard it, they said, “This teaching is difficult; who can accept it?” But Jesus, being aware that his disciples were complaining about it, said to them, “Does this offend you? Then what if you were to see the Son of Man ascending to where he was before? It is the spirit that gives life; the flesh is useless. The words that I have spoken to you are spirit and life. But among you there are some who do not believe.” For Jesus knew from the first who were the ones that did not believe, and who was the one that would betray him. And he said, “For this reason I have told you that no one can come to me unless it is granted by the Father.”

Because of this many of his disciples turned back and no longer went about with him. So Jesus asked the twelve, “Do you also wish to go away?” Simon Peter answered him, “Lord, to whom can we go? You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and know that you are the Holy One of God.”

Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself, and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all.

Bob's Music Notes

"Lift Up Your Heads" was authored by Weissel, born in 1590, a German pastor whose output of hymns was small (20) but significant for clarity of thought. Translator Winkworth is considered the finest in the field of German, being true to the original but fluent in poetic mastery. This hymn is based on Psalm 24.



"Help Us, O Lord" is by William Watkins Reid, Jr., a graduate of Oberlin and Yale Divinity Schools. He served as a medic overseas and spent eight months in a German prison. He was active in the Hymn Society and served in Methodist Churches. The tune is by Monk, best known for "Abide With Me." He was an editor of the famous "Hymns Ancient and Modern."

"Go Forward" was the work of Lawrence Tuttiett who started out as a physician but then took holy orders. He wrote several volumes of prayers in addition to hymns. Composer Smart is best known for this tune (with the text "Lead On, O King Eternal") and for Regent Square

"Angels From the Realms of Glory." He lost his sight at age 52 but continued to compose, so great was his musical memory. He also drew up specifications for new organs.

Today's trumpeter Patrick Julian was born in Youngstown, and raised in Canfield. He met Beth at Ohio U and married in 1984: three children and three grandchildren. As principal trumpeter for the Warren Junior Military Band, he toured the US, Canada, Hawaii, England, Scotland, and Wales. He is currently the lead trumpeter for the Canfield Community Band. He attended St. Rocco's Episcopal Church, Youngstown. He and Beth are valued members of our choir.


