FIRST READING:......Acts 16:16-34

With Paul and Silas, we came to Philippi in Macedonia, a Roman colony, and, as we were going to the place of prayer, we met a slave girl who had a spirit of divination and brought her owners a great deal of money by fortune-telling. While she followed Paul and us, she would cry out, "These men are slaves of the Most High God, who proclaim to you a way of salvation." She kept doing this for many days. But Paul, very much annoyed, turned and said to the spirit, "I order you in the name of Jesus Christ to come out of her." And it came out that very hour.

But when her owners saw that their hope of making money was gone, they seized Paul and Silas and dragged them into the marketplace before the authorities. When they had brought them before the magistrates, they said, "These men are disturbing our city; they are Jews and are advocating customs that are not lawful for us as Romans to adopt or observe." The crowd joined in attacking them, and the magistrates had them stripped of their clothing and ordered them to be beaten with rods. After they had given them a severe flogging, they threw them into prison and ordered the jailer to keep them securely. Following these instructions, he put them in the innermost cell and fastened their feet in the stocks.

About midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God, and the prisoners were listening to them. Suddenly there was an earthquake, so violent that the foundations of the prison were shaken; and immediately all the doors were opened and everyone's chains were unfastened. When the jailer woke up and saw the prison doors wide open, he drew his sword and was about to kill himself, since he supposed that the prisoners had escaped. But Paul shouted in a loud voice, "Do not harm yourself, for we are all here." The jailer called for lights, and rushing in, he fell down trembling before Paul and Silas. Then he brought them outside and said, "Sirs, what must I do to be saved?" They answered, "Believe on the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved, you and your household." They spoke the word of the Lord to him and to all who were in his house.

At the same hour of the night he took them and washed their wounds; then he and his entire family were baptized without delay. He brought them up into the house and set food before them; and he and his entire household rejoiced that he had become a believer in God.

Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself, and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all.

Bob's Music Notes

"Whoever Would Be Great Among You" must be the servant of all - Jesus' words in Matthew 20 when the mother of James and John asked Jesus for special honors for her sons. This well-crafted anthem is the work of Ronald A. Nelson, Lutheran musician, not to be confused with another Nelson who wrote band music. In this work, the baritones sing the theme, which is augmented each time by female descants. This altruistic thought would be condemned by Ayn Rand, author of "Atlas Shrugged". and "The Fountainhead," who believed in the primacy of "me."



"All Hail the Power of Jesus' Name" was authored by Edward Perronet, son of an Anglican priest, friend of the Wesleys. Called the "National Anthem of Christianity," this stately text is set to several tunes of which "Coronation" is the best known, actually one of America's earliest tunes by a Baptist who was in the Revolutionary War and a friend of George Washington.

"Christ, Whose Glory Fills the Skies" is another Charles Wesley gem, and it's in the "Morning" section of our Hymnal with references to light, sun, dayspring, and daystar. "Ratisbon" is a German town from which came this 1524 melody. Hymns of the morning seem to have an upward melody, just like this one.

"Alleluia! Sing to Jesus" was not written by a clergyman but by a Glasgow marine insurance man with a gift for poetry. His best-known text is "As With Gladness Men of Old." Tune "Hyfrydol" (huv-RUH-dol) means "agreeable, pleasurable" by Welshman Pritchard.
