First Reading: Genesis 17:1-7, 15-16

When Abram was ninety-nine years old, the LORD appeared to Abram, and said to him, "I am God Almighty; walk before me, and be blameless. And I will make my covenant between me and you, and will make you exceedingly numerous." Then Abram fell on his face; and God said to him, "As for me, this is my covenant with you: You shall be the ancestor of a multitude of nations. No longer shall your name be Abram, but your name shall be Abraham; for I have made you the ancestor of a multitude of nations. I will make you exceedingly fruitful; and I will make nations of you, and kings shall come from you. I will establish my covenant between me and you, and your offspring after you throughout their generations, for an everlasting covenant, to be God to you and to your offspring after you.

Second Reading: Romans 4:13-25

For the promise that he would inherit the world did not come to Abraham or to his descendants through the law but through the righteousness of faith. If it is the adherents of the law who are to be the heirs, faith is null and the promise is void. For the law brings wrath; but where there is no law, neither is there violation.

For this reason it depends on faith, in order that the promise may rest on grace and be guaranteed to all his descendants, not only to the adherents of the law but also to those who share the faith of Abraham (for he is the father of all of us, as it is written, "I have made you the father of many nations")—in the presence of the God in whom he believed, who gives life to the dead and calls into existence the things that do not exist. Hoping against hope, he believed that he would become "the father of many nations," according to what was said, "So numerous shall your descendants be." He did not weaken in faith when he considered his own body, which was already as good as dead (for he was about a hundred years old), or when he considered the barrenness of Sarah's womb. No distrust made him waver concerning the promise of God, but he grew strong in his faith as he gave glory to God, being fully convinced that God was able to do what he had promised. Therefore his faith "was reckoned to him as righteousness." Now the words, "it was reckoned to him," were written not for his sake alone, but for ours also. It will be reckoned to us who believe in him who raised Jesus our Lord from the dead, who was handed over to death for our trespasses and was raised for our justification.

For you are setting your mind not on divine things but on human things."

For what will it profit them to gain the whole world and forfeit their life? Indeed, what can they give in return for their life? Those who are ashamed of me and of my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, of them the Son of Man will also be ashamed when he comes in the glory of his Father with the holy angels."

THE NICENE CREED (Please Stand as You Are Able)

We believe in one God. the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself, and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus

Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all.

He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself, in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.

Bob's Music Notes

Ken's solo was written (words and music) in 1893 by the organist of McConnellsville OH Trinity ME Church, one of 1000 from her pen. Failing eyesight in her later years led to her son constructing a large chalkboard which she used to write her music. Christ is at first a "stranger" but by the refrain, no longer.

"Now Quit Your Care" is the happiest Lenten hymn we'll sing this year. The tune started life as a Christmas song telling the shepherds ("pasteurs") to quit their sheep and run to Bethlehem. The Lenten text is by Anglican Percy Dearmer (b.1867) who, along with RVW and Martin Shaw was responsible for reviving ancient music in the church. He was a canon of Westminster Abbey.

"My Faith Looks Up To Thee" came about at a Boston meeting with Congregational clergyman Ray Palmer and Lowell Mason in 1830 when the latter was compiling a hymnal "Spiritual Songs for Social Worship." Mason is considered America's first noted music educator with 1000 tunes to his credit, including "Mary Had A Little Lamb!" He was president of Boston's Handel and Haydn Society. He was the father of Henry Mason who founded the piano firm of Mason & Hamlin, known as the "poor man's Steinway," one of which I owned and just donated to Canton Christian Home Chapel.

"How Firm A Foundation" comes from a 1787 hymnal compiled by John Rippon - a favorite hymn of Robert E. Lee. The marvelous pentatone (which can be played just on the black keys) is from the 1844 hymnal "The Sacred Harp."

The choir selection is by Kurt Kaiser (1934-2018), an influential modern composer. At age 12 he was performing on Chicago's radio WMBI and went on to copyright 300 songs. He became associated with the Word publishers in Waco TX.


