In contrast to the river safari is the Makanyi Game Lodge. Seven luxurious villas offer panoramic views of the bush and animals. Land Rovers with no more than two couples leave at first light and at midafternoon for three hour safari game rides. The tracker and guide follow animals' signs to find rhinos, giraffes, gnus, antelopes, lions, elephants and leopards. Within fifteen minutes into our first game ride a mother white rhino protects her baby from a large male just feet away from us.



In colonial British style, a stop for coffee or brandy and nibbles and a stop for gin and tonic or wine and nibbles is a must. The Tracker lays out a picnic on a table folding up from the front of the Land Rover. A hyaena and a herd of elephants join us during two of our breaks at a pond. Young elephants playing, others trumpeting and lots of slurping make wonderful photo moments. The sunrises and sunsets present colorful canvases of glorious colors. More photos. Outdoor dining under the Southern Cross at the lodge, conversations with new friends made during the tour glue the moments of nearly overwhelming experiences into warm, lasting memories.
