- Feeling feverish, having chills
- Temperature of 100.4° F or greater
- Loss of taste or smell
- New or unexplained persistent cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing

MINOR SYMPTOMS

- Sore throat
- Runny nose or congestion
- Muscle or body aches
- Headache
- Fatigue
- Nausea, vomiting
- Diarrhea

- 1. Send to Sick Room/Health Office to be evaluated.
- 2. If Health Office determines it is related to a Chronic Condition, may send student or staff back to class.
- 3. If assessed Sick, a surgical mask is placed on the student/staff, if safe to do so.
- 4. Student will remain in isolation location or room until parent picks up
- 1. Follow routine illness care.
- 2. Return to class if appropriate. Alert teacher to monitor the student with heightened awareness.
- 3. Record health visit in I.C.

Low/Minimal Levels of Community Transmission

Students/Staff with two or more Minor symptoms or one or more Major symptom

- 1. Call parents and send home. Send staff home.
- 2. If symptoms worsen or last longer than 48–72 hours, contact your doctor to see if a COVID-19 PCR test is indicated.
- 3. Follow COVID-19 Return to School/Work guidance.

Sustained Community Transmission

or the ill person lived, worked or traveled to an area with sustained transmission

Students/Staff with one or more Major or Minor Symptom

- 1. Call parents to pick up ASAP. Send staff home.
- 2. Call your doctor and ask for a COVID PCR test within 24-48 hours or go to testing sites. If staff symptoms do not improve in 24hours or has a Major Symptom, they need to get tested.
- 3. Staff call the Nurse or Nick Xenos regarding Symptoms and Test results.
