You will need to enter a name and an email address in order to register, but you are welcome to use a "fake" name if you prefer, and any temporary email address where you will receive more details. Each focus group will take about one hour. You will need to have access to the email you provide in order to receive confirmation of your registration and information about how to join the webinar.
