

Purpose: The Small Molecule Screening Center is a developing shared resource that provides investigators with support for collaborative, translational research that should result in discovery and development of new targeted therapies for cancer treatment. The goal of this RFA is to support the development of novel assays to be used in the Small Molecule Screening Center developing shared resource. Successful applicants will receive funding to offset the costs of developing a novel assay to be used for research projects in small molecule screening that are expected to yield innovative discoveries, peer-reviewed publications and new grant funding, as well as a bridge to collaborations with pharmaceutical companies and other industry partnerships. Assays developed via this funding mechanism will also be made available to future users of the Small Molecule Screening Center developing shared resource.

Review Criteria and Process: All applications will be evaluated and scored by a multi-disciplinary committee according to scientific merit and in accordance with this RFA. Proposals will be evaluated according to the degree to which they:

- are scientifically novel
- have specific objectives
- have a tractable synthesis
- present robust and operational quantitative assays
- are likely to lead to extramural research support within the short term
- are likely to be completed in a 12-month period or less

Applicant Eligibility: All eligible investigators must hold a full-time faculty appointment and be a research program member of Rutgers Cancer Institute of New Jersey. The projects are intended to provide support for scientifically valid new ventures that are not so highly developed that other sources of competitive funding are likely to be available. The intent of this program is to generate sufficient preliminary data to provide the basis for the application for independent support through conventional peer-reviewed and other funding mechanisms.

Terms of Award

- During the proposal submission stage, a Rutgers Funding Proposal is not necessary. However, before any internal award funds are dispersed a Rutgers Funding Proposal is REQUIRED.
- When relevant, all awards must have appropriate institutional regulatory approvals (IRB, IACUC, etc.) before funds will be disbursed.
- Applicants may receive up to \$10,000 of support for their research project.
- Principal Investigators will be required to submit a brief final report describing the results of their work, as well as related publications and funding, and may be required to present their work to Rutgers Cancer Institute's Research Leadership Council.
