What is Program Evaluation?

Program evaluation is a systematic process for collecting, analyzing and using information to answer important questions about the need for, thinking behind, quality of, and effects of programs.

Logic Models & Theories of Change



Logic models and theories of change unlock the front door of program evaluation.

Logic Models & Theories of Change



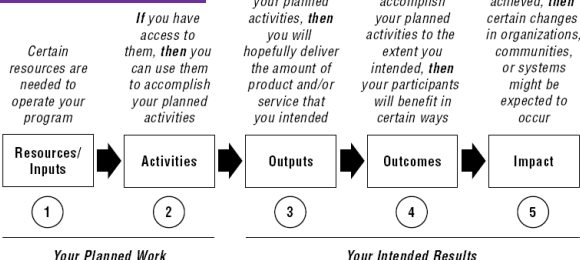
- A logic model is a visual diagram that illustrates how your program is intended to work.
- A theory of change describes in writing how your program is intended to work.



They are used to communicate how your projects, programs, operations, resources, activities, and goals are related to one another.

They are used in all aspects of program planning, implementation, communication, and evaluation.

PROGRAM LOGIC/THEORY Basic Elements

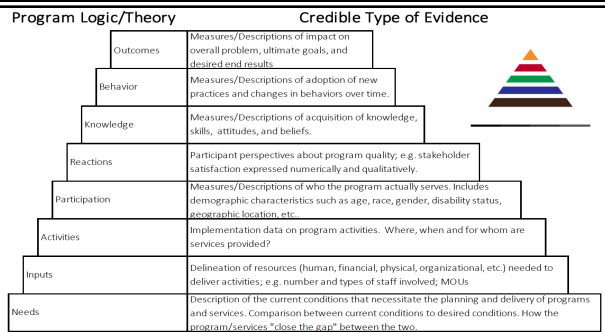
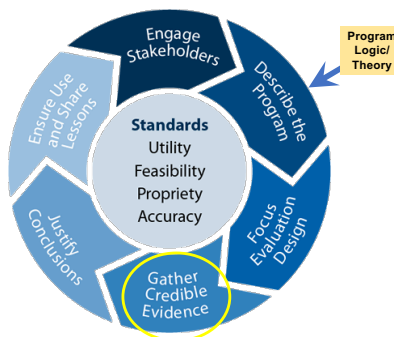
- 1) Primary **NEED** for the program

- 5) Envisioned long-term **OUTCOMES**

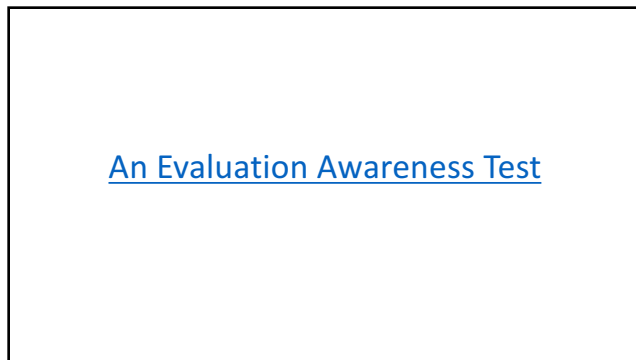
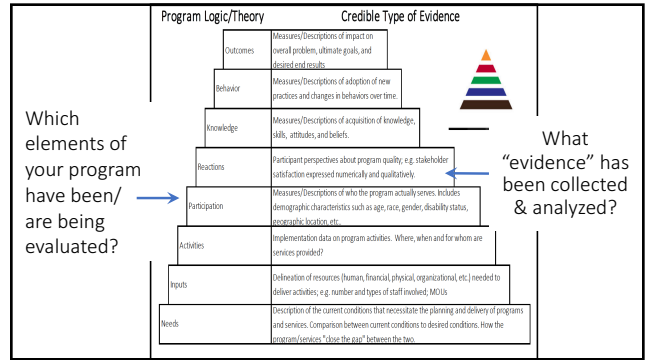
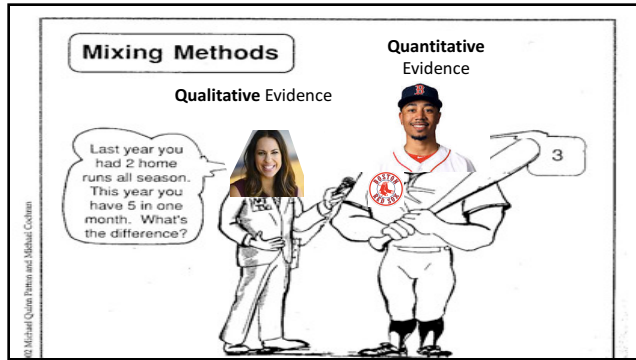

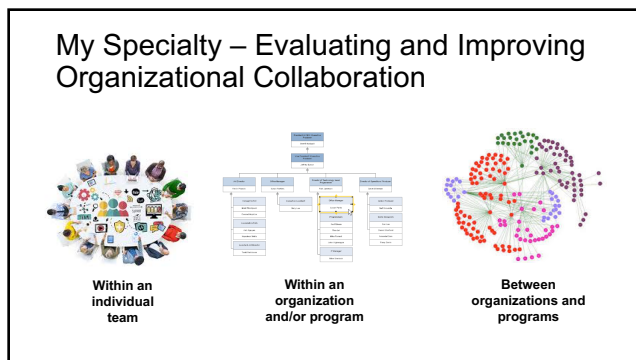
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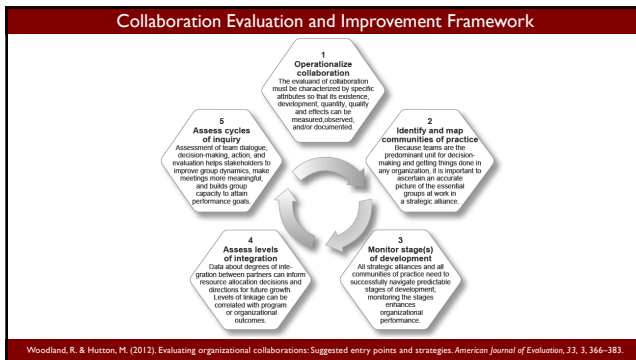




Program Evaluation – Some Common Pitfalls

- Wrong program element assessed
- Overlooking issues of race, gender, class, etc.
- Wrong evaluation question
- Program "evaluand" not "operationalized" (e.g. what constitutes a successful "pass")
- Numbers are over-emphasized/valued
- Unplanned/unintended elements not assessed (e.g. the moonwalking bear)
