Training Description and Core Clinical Components:	<p>This live virtual training is designed for specialty providers, which will focus on information of substance use disorders. The presentation will focus on general education meant to inform the staff about the characteristics and multiple presentations of relapse. The presentation will focus on healthy coping skills including hands-on activities to engage the participants in the process of the decision-making model with regards to the consequences to using substances.</p> <p>This educational session is meant as a resource for participants to utilize when working with adults who are considered at risk of substance use disorders. Participants will be able to identify appropriate resources within the LA County Substance Abuse Prevention and Control's Substance Use Disorder's Continuum of Care.</p> <p><i>Through group discussion, chat, and polls participants will be engaged throughout the training.</i></p>

Describe the three (3) different states when someone returns to a stopped behavior. 2. Identify two (2) general healthy coping skills to help prevent a relapse. 3. Identify two (2) personal healthy coping skills to help prevent a relapse. 4. Develop an action plan to help prevent a relapse or minimize the impact of use.
