

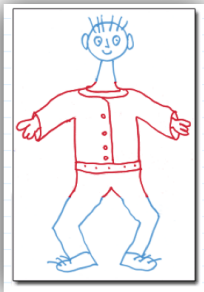
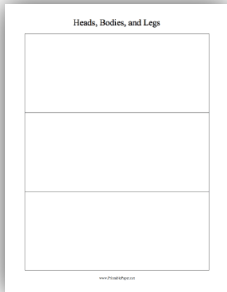


Wee Play & Learn



Wee Mentors (6+ years): Heads, Bodies, Legs Game

A fun, classic game that promotes a sense of belonging and encourages teamwork!



What to do:

1. Print out the game sheet before starting the game (source link below) or use a blank piece of paper folded in 3 parts.
2. The first player draws a head on the top box with the neck extending down to the second box and hands it to the second person so they can only see the neck and not the head.
3. The second player draws the body on the middle box with the tops of legs extending into the 3rd and final box, and then folds it down so the next person cannot see the head or body.
4. The third player draws the legs and feet on the bottom box.
5. Once everyone has completed their drawing, unfold the page and look at what each person has drawn. The sillier the drawings the funnier the picture.
6. Variation: you can add a fourth box for writing or naming the picture. You can draw various things beside a person to make the picture funnier.
