

TOGETHER WEE CAN "CELEBRATES CANADA 150" 2017

We are excited to kick off another fantastic Together Wee Can program, "Together Wee Can Celebrates Canada 150".

In honour of Canada celebrating 150 years in 2017, Wee Watch children and Providers will spend the year exploring all parts of Canada; 10 provinces, 3 territories, time zones, landscape, culture, food, celebrations and famous attractions.

We started our journey exploring Nunavut, Canada's arctic.

February: Quebec – Winter Carnival

Bienvenue au Quebec (welcome to Quebec)! Quebec was one of the original four provinces that formed Canada in 1867.

While children explore Quebec this month they will learn about the famous Winter Carnival and its mascot Bonhomme, they will also attempt to build their own coloured ice sculptures & snow sculptures just as they do in the carnival. Providers and children will also make the famous, delicious, winter treat known as Maple Taffy.

March: The Yukon & Northwest Territories – Northern Lights

During the month of March "Together Wee Can Celebrates Canada 150" takes us way up north while we explore the other two territories in Canada; The Yukon and Northwest Territories.

While exploring northern Canada, children will discover one of the natural wonders of the world, the northern lights. The northern lights, also known as "Aurora Borealis", look like colourful dancing lights in the sky. Children will have the opportunity to create their own northern lights in the snow using multi coloured glow sticks or snow paint in spray bottles. Children will also build a mini dog sled, dig for "gold", read stories about the territories and make Bannock Bread, a specialty in northern parts of Canada.
