December: Saskatchewan


This month marks the end of Together Wee Can Celebrates Canada 150. During the month of December Providers and children will be exploring our final destination, Saskatchewan.

Did you know Saskatchewan is the sunniest place in Canada? On average it gets 2537 hours of sun per year. But it is also the most tornado active parts in Canada, averaging roughly 12-18 tornados per year.

While exploring Saskatchewan, children will learn about the Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP). The RCMP are the national police force of Canada. In Saskatchewan you can take in a one of a kind experience, the Sergeant Major's Parade. The parade includes a roll call and inspection of the troop, accompanied by the cadet band.

Children will make their very own mini Mountie, Mountie hat, and horse.

While in the kitchen children will help make homemade bread. Saskatchewan is known as the "breadbasket" of Canada because it produces the most wheat in Canada and wheat is used to make bread.
