Wee Beginners (0-18 months): Read and Stack

Reading to a child from a very young age is critical for language and literacy development and building a love of reading. Choose a great book, snuggle up and read! Adding further visual cues to a book you read often is a great way to reinforce a story and recognition in a young child.



What you need:

- Story book of your choice (board books are great for this age so they can turn the pages)
- Photocopier or print images on next page that go along with the popular "Brown Bear, Brown Bear what do you See", book by Erick Carle and Bill Martin
- Stacking Cups or Blocks

What to do:

1. Photocopy key pages from the story you are reading and cut out characters or key pictures (or use the ones on the next page)
2. Tape the images to stacking cups in sequence from the beginning of the story at the bottom of the stack
3. As you read the story, stack the images in sequence
4. You can leave the images on the cups and put them around the room for your child to crawl to and discover. Reinforce by reminding them of the part of the story the image relates to.



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
