MANAGING TBI AS A CHRONIC HEALTH CONDITION TO OPTIMIZE OUTCOMES

Dr. Hammond is a board certified Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation physician (Physiatrist) who is an active clinician, researcher, and administrator. She completed her medical degree at Tulane University School of Medicine, Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation residency at Baylor College of Medicine, and brain injury medicine fellowship at the Rehabilitation Institute of Michigan. She is professor and Chair of Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation at Indiana University School of Medicine; Chief of Medical Affairs and Brain Injury Medical Director at the Rehabilitation Hospital of Indiana. She is project director of the Indiana Traumatic Brain Injury Model System. Dr. Hammond's research and advocacy focuses on the long-term issues confronting individuals with disability and treatment effectiveness.

Dr. Taylor practices Neuropsychology and serves as Research Director and Professor of Pediatrics at University Hospitals of Cleveland and visiting Professor at the Nationwide Children's Hospital Research Institute. He was co-researcher in development of a web-based intervention for adolescent survivors of TBI and their families.
