

## Meetings with Volusia Legislative delegation.....

Rep Leek was extremely glad to work with Rep Patrick Henry on legislation to place a statue of Mary McLeod-Bethune in the National Statuary Hall in Washington DC.

He also was successful in getting a Constitutional Amendment on the November 6 ballot to require a 2/3 House/Senate approval to increase taxes/fees.

At the end, House and Senate leaders were unable to reach agreement in regards to gambling. However, the Seminole Tribes' payments to the State will continue. It was noted that a constitutional amendment will appear on November 6 ballot calling for voter approval of future gambling measures in the State.

Local projects included-

- \$2.5 million - Williamson Blvd widening
- \$750,000 - Pt Orange Stormwater project II
- \$4.3 million - Daytona State College
- \$2.5 million - ERAU
- \$50,000 - S Daytona Stormwater Project

The committee thanked Rep Leek (and Dylan Fisher) for their work this past session.
