Feed My Starving Children

FEED MY STARVING CHILDREN (FMSC) is a Christian non-profit organization committed to feeding God's starving children. They have developed a process they call "Mobil Pack" that allows them to pack, label and box thousands of meals in a weekend. Locally, the Turning Point Church Mechanicsburg is hosting a Mobil Pack operation on the weekend of March 13-15. Their goal is to raise \$65,000 and pack over 200,000 meals.

The Mission Committee is recruiting a team to volunteer on Friday March 13th for either the 2-4 PM or the 6-8 PM shift. Not all work requires standing. While donations are welcome, they are not required. Early volunteer registration begins on February 9th. Earth Care - Can black plastic be recycled, part 2:

Some black plastic is made from electronic waste which can contain electronic waste. This can cause a problem if the waste is used for food containers, especially take-out containers. Therefore:

- Don't put black plastic in curbside recycling unless your local program accepts them. If you cannot reuse or repurpose them, throw them in the trash.
- Avoid buying products packaged in black plastic.
- Don't reuse black plastic containers for food storage, since they might be contaminated with toxic chemicals.
