The dates are August 15-19, 2022, from 9 am – 12 noon. The theme, *Celebrating God's World*, will include earth-care education, creative drama, crafts, recreation, songs, snacks and a special pageant at the end of the week. Registration will open up July 6, 2022 and will be accessible online and through paper registration forms in the Gathering Place. 




