

Discover the Arizona Faith Network

Have you ever wondered what it might look like for people of different faiths to truly come together—not just to coexist, but to learn from one another, serve alongside one another, and build something better together?

That’s the heart of the **Arizona Faith Network (AFN)**.

AFN is a statewide interfaith organization that brings together people from many religious traditions to foster understanding, strengthen community relationships, and work for the common good. Their guiding vision is simple but powerful: *“Be Together • Talk Together • Act Together.”*

What Does AFN Do?

The Arizona Faith Network offers a wide variety of opportunities for learning, connection, and action. Their events are designed to be welcoming and accessible—whether you are deeply involved in interfaith work or just curious to learn more.

Some examples from a recent newsletter include:

- **Interfaith Learning & Dialogue**
Book studies and conversations that explore shared values across traditions, such as discussions on Judaism, Christianity, and Islam or reflections on American ideals like justice and liberty.
- **Sacred Site Visits**
Opportunities to visit and learn from different faith communities in the Phoenix area, deepening understanding through firsthand experience.
- **Spiritual Practices**
Weekly online meditation gatherings that offer a chance to pause, reflect, and begin the week grounded in peace.

Interfaith Prayer Walk & Day at the Capitol

One upcoming opportunity to experience the Arizona Faith Network in action is the **Interfaith Prayer Walk and Day at the Capitol**, happening on **Wednesday, March 25 (8:00 am – 4:00 pm)** at the Arizona State Capitol.

This day brings people of many faiths together as *one beloved community*—beginning with a peaceful prayer walk and continuing with a day of connection, conversation, and public witness.

Participants will:

- Join in prayer for our community and state
- Build relationships across faith traditions
- Engage in respectful conversation with state legislators

You are welcome to come for part or all of the day. Whether you are new to interfaith work or already engaged, this is a meaningful way to live out our faith in community with others.

- **Community Engagement & Advocacy**

Events like interfaith prayer walks, gatherings at the Capitol, and civic education opportunities that encourage people of faith to work together for justice, peace, and the well-being of all.

- **Workshops & Educational Events**

Programs addressing important topics such as Indigenous history, environmental justice, and community health—helping participants grow in awareness and compassion.

In short, AFN creates spaces where relationships are built, understanding is deepened, and faith is lived out in meaningful ways.

Why It Matters

In a world that often feels divided, the Arizona Faith Network reminds us that connection is possible. By bringing people together across lines of difference, AFN helps cultivate empathy, mutual respect, and shared action for the common good.

For those of us seeking to live out our faith in community—with openness, curiosity, and compassion—this is a meaningful way to engage beyond our own walls.
