

Bills we're watching

[HB 1094](#)

Revises certain provisions regarding the municipal zoning and appeals process to be less burdensome; is companion legislation to SB 157 last year that updated the county zoning and appeals process.

[HB 1109](#)

Modifies requirements and restrictions related to certain alcoholic beverages. This would legalize homebrewing in the state of SD.

[HB 1133](#)

Reduces fees for annual state park licenses for South Dakota residents. Reduces fee for state park annual passes by 25% for resident of SD.

[HB 1203](#)

Authorizes banks to engage in business with industrial hemp or marijuana licensees and associated persons.

[HB 1211](#)

Authorizes, regulates, and taxes wagering on sporting events across the state but limited to establishments that hold a full beverage liquor license. This bill does not allow sports bets at lottery outlets or mobile devices.

[SB 103](#)

Provides for the confidentiality of personal information of persons affiliated with nonprofit corporations and to provide a penalty therefor.

[SB 123](#)

Requires a comment period for the attorney general's statement regarding initiated measures and initiated amendments.

[HB 1247](#)

Provides for the protection of the consciences of medical professionals. Would allow physicians, health care providers, and employers to invoke religious freedom to refrain from carrying out or funding surgeries or procedures. Doctors in SD can already do this, and appropriate care is identified to allow for care to still be administered.

[SB 177](#)

Revises the provisions of parental choice regarding compulsory school attendance and matters ancillary thereto. Addresses the relationship between home-schooled students and the school district in which they reside. Under current law these issues are left to local school boards. This bill will set the same rules for all school districts which include allowing participation in extracurricular activities without attending classes and without verifiable confirmation of equivalent GPA. It also excuses students from statewide testing in certain grades.
