## Leadership Transition at St. Andrew

As we begin the New Year, we have several members stepping into new roles in the leadership of St. Andrew By-The-Sea. Among these changes, Bob Dietz has been appointed as the new Chair of the Church Council. Bob succeeds Sarah Coffin, who has taken on a new responsibility as Chair of the Trustees.



Bob comes to the role as a faithful servant of Christ and the United Methodist Church, having been a lifelong member of the UMC. He is originally from northern New Jersey, where he began his career with Colgate Palmolive, which spanned numerous roles and locations over his 39 years with the company. During his tenure with Colgate, he held various roles of increasing responsibility, leading to positions which included General manager of Oral Care in Europe, VP of Product Supply Chain for Asia, VP of Product Supply for Europe, VP of Product Supply Global Personal Care, VP of Global Design and Packaging and VP of Global Facilities and Construction Management. Many of these roles included international posting, where he and his family lived, including Australia, Malaysia, the UK, France, and Switzerland.

Bob has also been very involved in the life of the United Methodist Church, serving in various roles at his local church in NJ, including Finance and Church Council. He has also served on various boards for the Greater New Jersey UMC Annual Conference, including as chair of the Council on Finance and Administration and the Centenary fund, as well as being a member of the Board of Pensions. He has also served on the boards of other institutions, including the UM Communities in NJ and the Seabrook here on Hilton Head.

Bob and his wife Merryl have two grown sons, Jacob and Christian, who live in the NY area. He enjoys leisure time as a woodworker, cooking and amateur radio enthusiast, as well as an occasional round of leisurely golf. Over the past years his participation here at St. Andrew has included singing in the choir, Chair of the Finance Committee, Endowment, as well as cooking for the Soup Kitchen and other events including Christmas Grace.

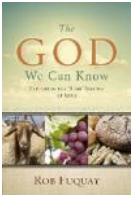

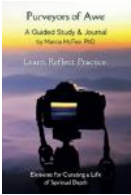

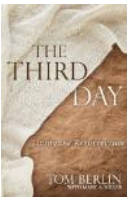


**Purveyors of Awe: Elements for Curating a Life of Spiritual Depth**

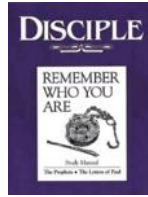

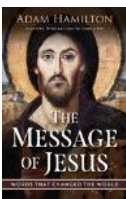
Let's start this 40-day journey together, sharing glimpses of our lives with one another. Let this be an intentional time, even for a few minutes a day, to pause, remember and reflect.

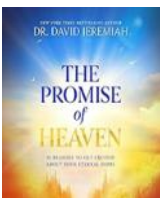

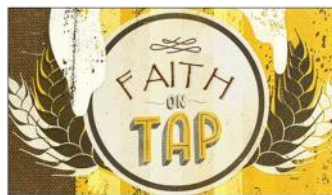

No matter what the circumstances, grief is a painful, confusing process. A GriefShare group is a safe, welcoming place where people understand the difficult emotions of grief. During this 13-week support group program, participants discover what to expect in the days ahead and what’s “normal” in grief. Since there are no neat, orderly stages of grief, participants learn helpful ways of coping with grief in all its unpredictability—and receive solid support each step of the way.

At weekly meetings, participants view videos featuring respected counselors, pastors, and healthcare professionals on grief-related topics, plus relatable personal stories of grief. A small-group discussion allows people time to talk, share support, and personally apply what they learned from the video. Participants receive a book with valuable exercises for navigating their personal grieving process.

## ENDOWMENT FUND

### Charitable Remainder Trusts: *An Option for Planned Giving*

This article is part of an ongoing series from your Endowment Committee, designed to help inform or remind you about the various methods you can use to plan a legacy gift to the permanent Endowment Fund of St. Andrew By-The-Sea United Methodist Church. This month, we would like to highlight the Charitable Remainder Trust as one such option for your consideration.

A Charitable Remainder Trust is an irrevocable written agreement in which cash or assets (particularly highly appreciated assets such as stocks) can be used to fund the trust, usually avoiding capital gains taxes on the appreciated value and eventually benefitting a qualified charity, such as the Endowment Fund of our church. It can be structured to make annual payments in fixed or fluctuating amounts to the originator or his/her heirs, thereby providing an income stream for many years. There are also favorable tax deductions that can occur when the trust “remaining amount” is distributed to charity. Consult with your tax advisor for the specifics in your situation.

All gifts to the church’s Endowment Fund are kept in perpetuity and only the earnings are used to support church and community programs. ## Giving from Your IRA

Are you 70 1/2 or older? If you have a traditional IRA, rollover IRA, inherited IRA, inactive SEP IRA or SIMPLE IRA, did you know that you can make a charitable donation directly from your retirement account to a qualified charity, like St. Andrew By-The-Sea UMC, without having to pay federal income tax on the donation, even if you don’t itemized deductions on your federal tax return?

Federal law allows IRA owners who are at least 70 1/2 to make a charitable donation directly from an individual retirement account. These transfers, called qualified charitable distributions (QCDs), are not subject to federal income tax, nor is it included in your federal taxable income. In addition, a QCD allows you to maximize your charitable impact while counting towards your required minimum distributions (RMDs) for the year, if applicable.

The St. Andrew By-The-Sea Soup Kitchen enthusiastically enters its 16th year of supporting families, neighbors, and the community on the South Island in 2026. The heart of our mission is “serving,” which means more than simply providing meals—it encompasses care, compassion, and commitment from our dedicated team of over 40 servant-volunteers and the many guests we welcome each week.

#### **IMPACT BY THE NUMBERS**

- Meal Service: We provide 100 lunches every Tuesday and Friday, amounting to approximately 14,000 meals annually.
- Family Support: Each week, we welcome around 40 families (averaging 4 people each), plus 20 individuals—serving a total of approximately 180 guests on a regular basis.
- Groceries Distributed: Every week, \$4,000 worth of groceries are shared with our community, totaling \$200,000 in groceries each year.
- Blessing Box: Our Blessing Box offers groceries 24/7 to those in need.
- English Classes: Every Friday, we host English classes attended by 12 participants.
- Mary’s Closet: Distributes about 200 items of clothing every week.

#### **SUDS MONTH**

This past January, we hosted a Suds Month instead of a single Suds Sunday, a quarterly event where members of the St. Andrew By-The-Sea congregation were encouraged to bring essential hygiene products such as laundry detergent, shampoo, conditioner, bar soap, toothpaste, and toothbrushes. Every Friday, these hygiene products are distributed to our guest families. Our aim is to provide costly necessities, allowing families to allocate their limited finances to vital needs like housing and transportation.

We are seeking a volunteer to oversee our island-wide diaper program, which involves contacting organizations for donations and coordinating diaper collection. Those interested in helping with this important initiative are encouraged to contact Tom Sharp at 317.250.9626.

#### **FOOD DONATIONS AND BLESSING BOX**

In addition to hygiene items, food donations are always welcome. Non-perishable food items can be placed directly in the Blessing Box located on the walkway between the two parking lots at any time or on Sundays on the way to worship. Lists of commonly needed items are available at both the Soup Kitchen shopping cart and the Blessing Box. We invite you to become a regular contributor making giving a weekly habit.

#### **WAYS TO SERVE**

While much of our food and produce is sourced from Second Helpings and Deep Well, we must still purchase

cooking and cleaning supplies, takeout containers, water, condiments, and more. All financial support comes directly from church members through St. Andrew’s Missions + Outreach and broader community contributions. Please consider becoming a regular financial supporter—your generosity is deeply appreciated.

#### **A COMMUNITY BUILT ON SERVICE**

The St. Andrew By-The-Sea Soup Kitchen offers ample opportunities for personal contribution and creative involvement. As “Soupers,” we are grateful for the exceptional support and continued participation of our community as we work together to help South Island families on their journey toward a brighter tomorrow. # Random Acts of Kindness

## Throw Kindness Around Like confetti for "Random Acts of Kindness Week"

The week of Valentine's Day is Random Acts of Kindness Week. Because our culture associates Valentine's Day with love, it affords us a perfect time to show kindness to our neighbors.

As Christians, we believe followers of Christ should *lead the way* in showing kindness. Scripture tells us to put on kindness (Colossians 3:12) because one of the chief marks of Christian love is kindness (1 Corinthians 13:4). Better yet, our random acts of kindness can serve as *an arrow to the gospel*. God's kindness is meant to lead people to repentance (Romans 2:4). Showing kindness allows us to talk about the One who has shown us all great kindness by giving us seasons of joy and abundance (Matthew 5:44-45; Acts 14:17).

Such random acts of kindness are *not a replacement* for sharing the Gospel message, but they can be a powerful tool used by the God to inspire conviction of sin (Romans 12:20-21) and lead people to glorify God (Matthew 5:16). These acts of kindness also provide creative opportunities to start spiritual conversations.

## Connecting Heritage with Restoration

**CAMPBELL CHAPEL A.M.E.**  
 Campbell Chapel was part of a wave of Reconstruction-era A.M.E. churches organized to serve southern African American agricultural and occupational people. In 1861, it was one of two churches in the 13th S. Bluffton, Bluffton, which had 100 members. Since then, several times, the building was first purchased by new founding trustees for \$200. Campbell Chapel congregants worshipped here until 2004.

**CAMPBELL CHAPEL A.M.E.**  
 Built in 1853, this was originally Bluffton Methodist Episcopal Church. Organized by whites, the church's 216 members in 1861 included 181 African Americans, who were likely enslaved to its white congregants. The church caught fire during the Civil War but survived. By 1874, local freed people began worshipping here as an African Methodist Episcopal (A.M.E.) Church eventually known as Campbell Chapel.

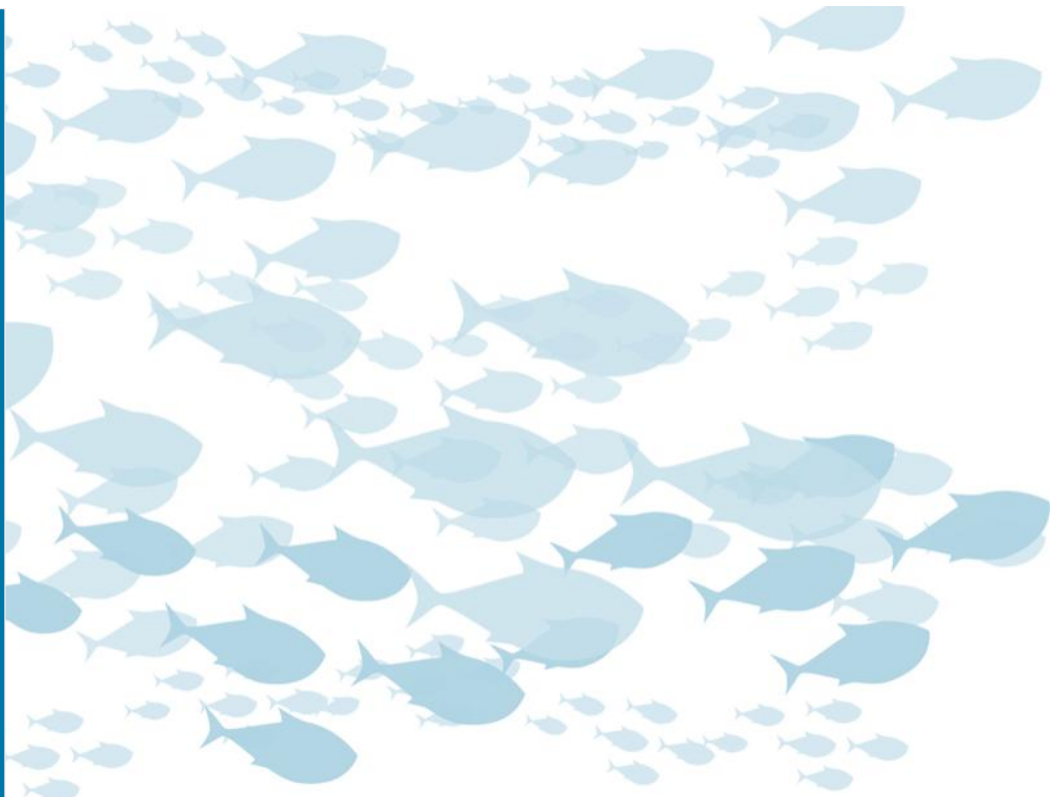
