### Today's Worship Notes

*The flowers today have been given by the Lamington Presbyterian Church congregation

We gather for worship this Sunday on the third most important festival of the Christian year: Pentecost. Compared to number one and number two, though—Easter and Christmas—this remembrance of the Holy Spirit inspiring the early church seems a very distant third. Who among us has ever been to a Pentecost party? Or who shows up all decked out in a new Pentecost outfit? In truth, Pentecost seems a bit baffling. There's a deep strangeness to this story: the tongues of fire, the rushing wind, the disciples speaking other languages—and what's more, understanding everything they hear. Deep down, the wonder of Pentecost is how they understand others who are so very different. Isn't that something we could use a lot more of, in our conflicted world?
