Each week in worship we strive for a partnership between word and music, but that is especially true this week as we consider our responsibility as Christians to care for the earth. Guest artist Judith Bettina will sing two solos, "To the Insects" and "Evening Rain," that celebrate the glories of nature. The words of Ezekiel that are our sermon text depict a struggle between God and Pharaoh over the River Nile: who truly owns it and who is merely the steward?

The cover image is an 1846 painting by Hubert Sattler, "The Colossi of Memnon During the Annual Flooding," from the Salzburg Museum. The waters of the Nile surround a pair of ancient statues depicting Pharaoh Amenhotep III, who reigned in the 14th Century BC.
