Today's Worship Notes

The song, "Canticle of the Turning," is hymn #100 in the *Glory to God* hymnal. Carl P. Daw, Jr. writes of it in *Glory to God: A Companion* (Westminster John Knox Press, 2016): "From the very beginning it is evident that this is no tame paraphrase of the Song of Mary (Luke 1: 46–55), often called by its first word in Latin, *Magnificat*. It identifies with, and draws energy from, the deeply revolutionary implications of what it means for the mighty to be put down from their thrones and for the lowly to be lifted up.... Yet there is also a significant difference here from most revolutionary songs. This one is not recruiting the singers to act on their own initiative but to be aware of how God has acted, is acting, and will continue to act — possibly through them." Of the folk tune to which the hymn is set, "Star of the County Down": "This pentatonic tune is the Irish cousin of KINGSFOLD (see no. 182). In some versions, the two tunes are identical, but the Irish example given here retains a bit more wildness than the domesticated English form. Several different folk-song texts associated with the tune concern a singularly beautiful young woman, who may either marry or scorn the singer, sometimes even sailing to America without him.... The tune name honors the beautiful young lady (the "star") from this northeastern county of Ireland, now one of the six counties in Northern Ireland."
