Today's Worship Notes

To mention demons in our modern age seems strange. Modern psychology and medicine leave no room for such explanations of mental or physical distress, and most of us are right there with the doctors, affirming their diagnoses. Yet, as Christians, we must come to terms with the fact the Bible, written from the standpoint of an ancient worldview, is full of instances of demonic possession. One of the strangest of such tales is Jesus' healing of a demon-possessed man in Luke 8:26-39. Until Jesus heals him, the man's behavior is strange enough; but then, after Jesus drives the demons out, the behavior of his neighbors is stranger still. They hate and fear Jesus for what he has done. Madness is more familiar to them than sanity. Change — even a change for the better — can cause upset in a family or community.
