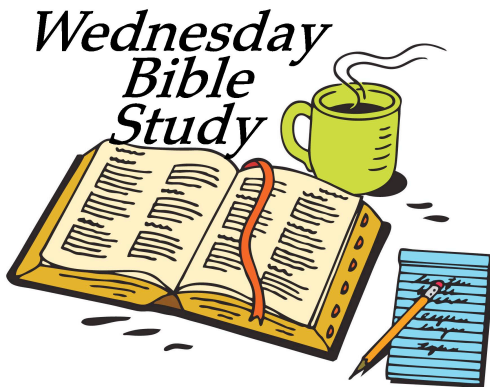

Wednesday Bible Study—Next meeting date is **May 15**. Come to the Manse for coffee and goodies Wednesday evenings from 7:00-8:00PM and for an adult study opportunity, based on the new book by Barry Ensign-George, "Six Themes Everyone Should Know: The Bible." Often, in studying the Bible, we zero in on a single passage. We don't look so often at the great themes that run through the entire Bible. These studies examine themes that are launched in the first 11 chapters of Genesis, then come in for a landing later, in the New Testament. The remaining themes are as follows:

4. **May 15:** Creatures of God: God Does Not Clone
(*Genesis 1:22,28; 9:7 and Revelation 21:24-26*)
5. **May 22:** Sin and Redemption: God Doesn't Go Back
(*Genesis 3:22-24 and John 20:24-29*)
6. **May 29:** Sending, Gathering, Sending Again: The Heartbeat of the Mission of God
(*John 1:1-16 and John 14:1-7, 25-31*)
