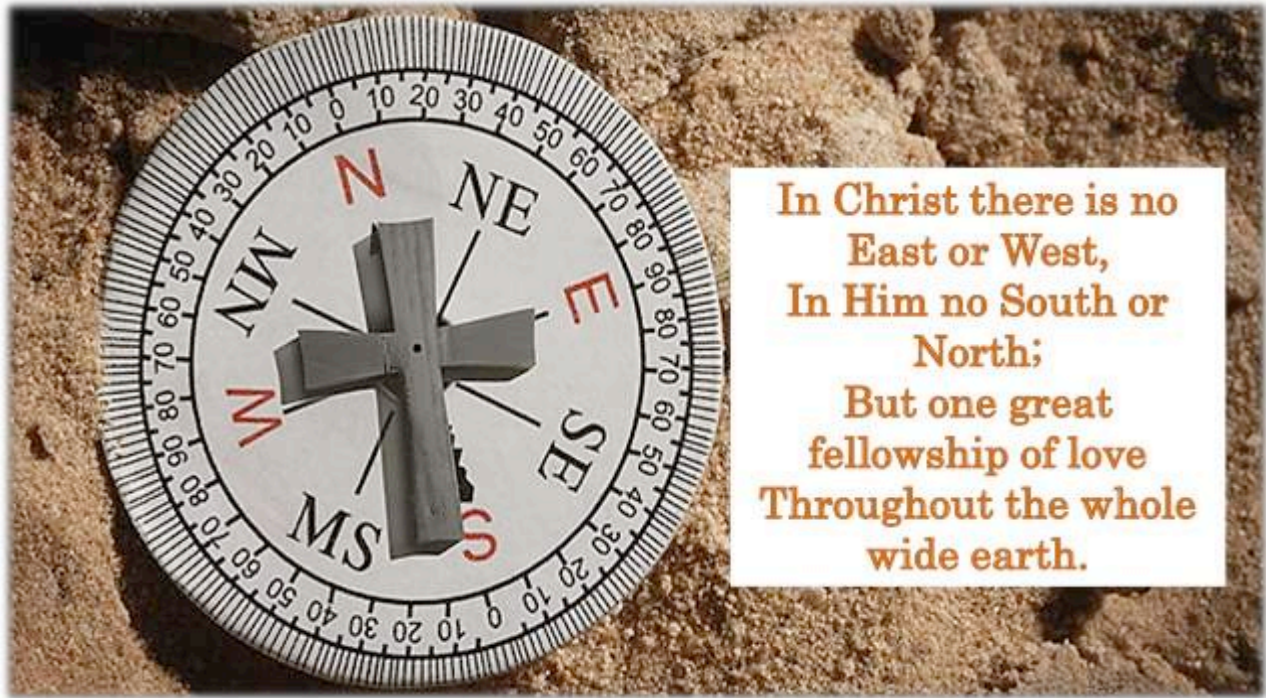


# THE LAMINGTON PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH

Perline is filling the role of International Peacemaker, sharing perspectives of Christians from her native Madagascar, with whom the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) is in mission partnership. Following the service and coffee hour, we invite you to linger for some more in-depth conversation.

Perline Rasoanirina Cooper has been an ordained pastor for 38 years in the 6-million member Church of Jesus Christ in Madagascar (FJKM). She has served as head of the Sunday School for the FJKM for 18 years, taught Biblical Hebrew at one of the FJKM's seminaries for 13 years, served as Vice President of the FJKM for 4 years, and headed up the FJKM AIDS Program for five years. She currently oversees the ministry of three Malagasy-speaking congregations in North America – Montreal, Ottawa and New York City. Perline lives in Albany, NY with her husband Bruce Cooper. They have one son, Allan Cooper.
