Today's Worship Notes

Today is the First Sunday in Lent, a season lasting 40 days from Ash Wednesday until Easter. We say "in" Lent, rather than "of" Lent, because Sundays in this season are like celebratory islands in what the church has historically considered to be a sea of fasting and other penitential disciplines. The word itself comes from the Old English "lencten," which means Spring. There's a good reason why that word sounds like our English word "lengthen," because Spring is the season of gradually lengthening days. Lent is a journey that culminates in Holy Week, during which we recall Jesus' sacrifice on the cross. Awareness of sin, and Jesus' redemption of we who are sinners, is the prevailing theme. We know, of course, that Good Friday is not the end of the story: the good news of resurrection awaits us on Easter Day. By adopting a Lenten discipline that calls to mind our need for salvation, we prepare ourselves for the joy of Easter.
