The flowers on the communion table have been given to the glory of God and in loving memory of Tom Rose, from his wife Laurel and their eight grandchildren.

The hymn after the sermon, “You Who Dwell in the Shelter of the Lord” — also known as “On Eagle’s Wings” — is one of the hymns in the *Glory to God* hymnal that we will soon be using here at Lamington Church. Based on Psalm 91, its words and music were written in 1978 by Michael Joncas after he learned of the death of a friend’s father. It was first sung at a visitation that preceded that funeral service, with guitar accompaniment. The hymn’s popularity began in Roman Catholic circles but has since spread around the world.

Consecration Sunday Is Coming

***It's Coming.
November 11,
2018***

Congregations that approach financial stewardship from a biblical perspective do not view the money Christians give to their church merely as a way to pay its bills. Rather, such congregations see financial contributions as a way to help people grow spiritually in their relationship with God by supporting their church's mission and ministry with a percentage of their incomes.

Our Session's Finance Committee has selected the *New Consecration Sunday Stewardship Program* as a way to teach the biblical and spiritual principles of generous giving in our stewardship education emphasis this year.

New Consecration Sunday is based on the biblical philosophy of the need of the giver to give for his or her own spiritual development, rather than on the need of the church to receive.

Instead of treating people like members of a social club who should pay dues, we will treat people like followers of Jesus Christ who want to give unselfishly as an act of discipleship. *New Consecration Sunday* encourages people toward proportionate and systematic giving in response to the question, "What percentage of my income is God calling me to give?"

During morning worship on Consecration Sunday, we are asking our attendees and members to make their financial commitments to our church's mission and ministries.

Every attendee and member who completes an *Estimate of Giving Card* does so voluntarily by attending morning worship on Consecration Sunday. We urge everyone to attend, even those who feel strongly opposed to completing a card. The procedure is done in such a way that no one feels personal embarrassment if he or she chooses not to fill out a card.

We will do no home solicitation to ask people to complete cards. During morning worship on Consecration Sunday, our guest leader will conduct a brief period of instruction and inspiration, climaxed by members making their commitments as a confidential act of worship.

We will encourage participation in Consecration Sunday events through the Consecration Sunday team and members of the Session and Board of Deacons. Since we will make no follow-up visits to ask people to complete their cards, we will make every effort to inform, inspire, and commit everyone to attend Consecration Sunday worship.
