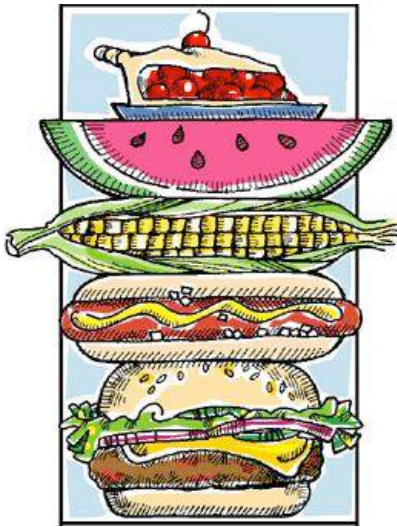

Thank you all for making this event possible and a memorable experience for our E'port friends!

The day started at 9:15AM, when we greeted the E'port bus at the Bedminster Farm Market. Bedminster mayor, Larry Jacobs, and Market Organizer, Robin Ray welcomed all. Nametags, string backpacks, sunglasses, money containers, and reusable water bottles, were handed out to our guests. Each team was given a shopping list, and \$25 to buy farm fresh ingredients for a dish they would later prepare together at Lamington. Everyone was also given a "scavenger hunt" list of trivia questions to be answered by the Market vendors. The children learned a great deal from talking to all the vendors, which included everything from food, to soap making, to environmental stewardship by the Raritan Headwaters. After our shopping was completed, we were treated to a cooking demonstration and tasting of fresh salads

Next, we caravanned to Lamington Church, where more volunteers were waiting in the kitchen to guide the children in the washing, slicing, dicing, and grating of produce to make a green salad, zucchini salad, salsa, homemade butter, and peaches and blueberries to go on top of ice cream. We feasted together on our freshly made salads and pizza in the Gladish Room. When we finished our ice cream, we changed into bathing suits, and headed to Christie Whitman's farm to meet the goats, pigs, horses and turkeys. Giving treats to the horses was a big hit, as was the tour of Christie's kitchen garden, where we were able to pick fresh blueberries!

The rest of the afternoon was enjoyed by all and filled with swimming in the pool and playing games in the yard. The epic day concluded with watermelon, and then it was time to say good-bye to our friends as they loaded the school bus to head home.
