In the wake of the recent storms, many of us have been living without electricity. It's an odd experience of being thrust backward in time, to the dark nights our ancestors knew so well. This Sunday, we'll recall how, in the third chapter of John, the Pharisee Nicodemus comes to see Jesus by night: because he doesn't want to be seen. Jesus chides him, saying "those who do what is true come to the light." It's a vivid image for the Christian life.
