Today's Worship Notes

"Noli me tangere" is the title of a number of classical religious paintings. The Latin comes from John 20:17, and translates "Do not touch me." It's something Jesus says to Mary Magdalene as she encounters him following the resurrection. Just why Jesus is hesitant to have Mary touch him, no one knows. Is it because he now has a resurrection body that's somehow different from the human body he once inhabited? Is it because Mary is clinging to him so tightly in her joy and astonishment that she actually keeps him from going where he needs to go? It's a mystery: but for us the phrase is heavy with meaning. We, too, wish we had something to hold onto as we seek to grasp the mystery of Jesus' resurrection.

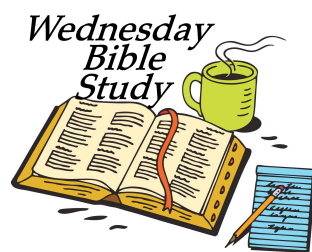

NEW ADULT BIBLE STUDY OPPORTUNITY - Beginning this Wednesday-April 24, come to the Manse for coffee and goodies from 7:00-8:00PM and for a new adult study opportunity, based on the new book by Barry Ensign-George, "Six Themes Everyone Should Know: The Bible." Often, in studying the Bible, we zero in on a single passage. We don't look so often at the great themes that run through the entire Bible. These studies examine themes that are launched in the first 11 chapters of Genesis, then come in for a landing later, in the New Testament. The themes are as follows:

1. The Great Arc of Creation, from Garden to Garden City (please read Genesis 2:4-15 and Revelation 21:9-14 and 22:1-5)
2. Creatures of God: Finite and Flourishing
3. Creatures of God: Mutually Dependent
4. Creatures of God: God Does Not Clone
5. Sin and Redemption: God Doesn't Go Back
6. Sending, Gathering, Sending Again: The Heartbeat of the Mission of God

Participants will be asked to make a donation of \$10 for the cost of their book. It would help our planning if you'd notify Regina in the church office that you're planning to come, but even if you don't, please come anyway!
