


# THE LAMINGTON PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH

Surely, Thomas is the most misunderstood of Jesus' disciples. Because he asked Jesus to first show him his wounds before he'd claim the truth of the resurrection, he's been known as "Doubting Thomas" ever since. But that's hardly a fair label. Thomas was out of the room when Jesus first appeared, so he didn't see what his fellow disciples saw. Once he did see the evidence, his declaration of faith was instantaneous. We'll take a good, long look at the story of this faithful apostle, who — according to tradition — later journeyed east and brought the good news to India.



**Wednesday Bible Study—Next meeting date is May 1.** Come to the Manse for coffee and goodies Wednesday evenings from 7:00-8:00PM and for an adult study opportunity, based on the new book by Barry Ensign-George, "Six Themes Everyone Should Know: The Bible." Often, in studying the Bible, we zero in on a single passage. We don't look so often at the great themes that run through the entire Bible. These studies examine themes that are launched in the first 11 chapters of Genesis, then come in for a landing later, in the New Testament. The remaining themes are as follows:
