NEDP (National External Diploma Program)

- Work individually with an assessor to demonstrate high school-level mastery of skills
- Competency based assessment using a computer-based program
- Student/Advisor sessions take place during the day and/or evening at East Hartford High School and Raymond Library
- Tutoring available in math, reading, and writing
