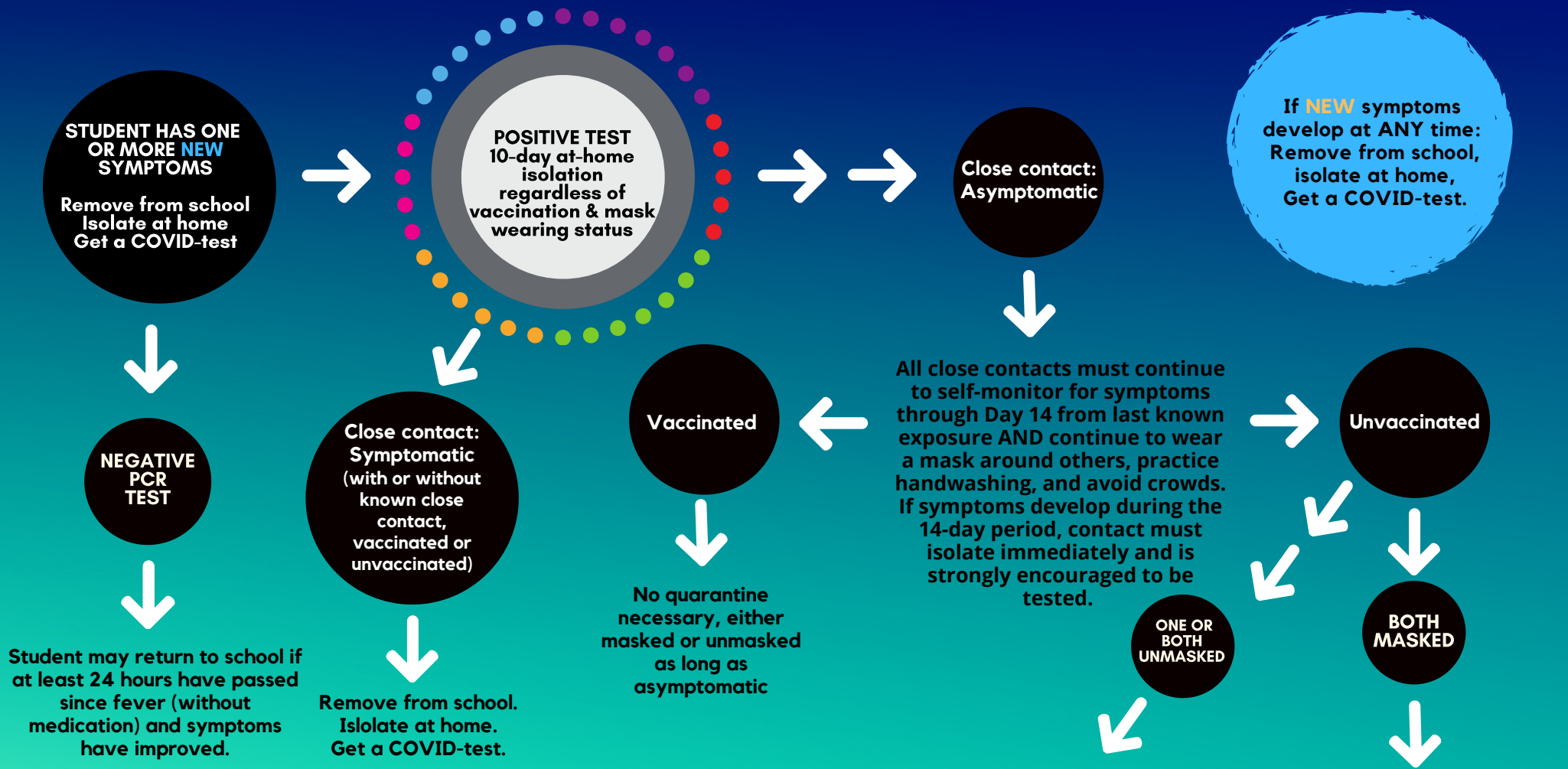


What happens when students have close contact with a positive case in school settings (minimum requirements)?

*Masked or unmasked, close contact is defined as within 6 feet for 15 minutes cumulatively within a 24-hour period.

SYMPTOMS

Fever or chills, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting, and diarrhea.

These symptoms may also be associated with a known chronic condition or another medical condition as determined by a healthcare provider. The concern is when symptoms are **NEW** or there has been close contact with someone with a confirmed case of COVID-19.

Quarantine at home.
Quarantine ends after Day 10 from exposure
OR
if asymptomatic, a negative test on Day 5 or later will enable the student to return to school on Day 8.

If the exposure occurred at school and the contact is asymptomatic: continues to attend school. Does not participate in extracurricular activities in school or community setting. Contact must continue to wear mask indoors and undergo testing at least twice during 10-day quarantine. A negative test on Day 5 will enable the student to end quarantine and return to normal activities on Day 8.
