Message from Our Nominating Committee Chair

Happy Fall Ya'll! It's that time of the year again – the leaves are changing color, the temperature is dropping and it's time to nominate our potential District Officers for the 2026-2027 Pilot Club Year. Here is a recap of the information I gave at Fall Council



- 1. **Our Florida District elects the following offices at our Convention in April:**
 - a. Governor Elect
 - b. Secretary
 - c. Treasurer
 - d. 2 Lieutenant Governors
- 2. **The Qualifications for those offices are the following:**
 - a. Governor Elect and Lieutenant Governors will have served as President of a Pilot Club.
 - b. Secretary or Treasurer will have served on a board for 2 years as President, President Elect, Secretary, Treasurer or Director. This qualification may be waived if necessary.
 - c. Nominees cannot serve as a District Officer, International Officer and/or Club President at the same time.
- 3. **The Deadline for the submission of all required documents is February 23, 2026.**

Well, that's good to know but who nominates and how does that happen. The good news is that any Pilot Club can nominate any Pilot for District Office. They do not even have to be a member of their club. All it takes is a vote by that club. The Nominating Club then sends a letter to the President of the Nominee's Club informing them of the nomination. Of course, if you are interested in being nominated, your club can nominate you. All that is left is for the Nominee to accept and do a little paperwork.

Next steps for the Nominee

- 1. Write a letter of acceptance or refusal
- 2. Fill out the Qualification Form which includes a small (300 words or less) Vision Statement in which the Nominee explains how they would contribute to Pilot International's mission and goals if elected and 2 Pilot references.
- 3. Mail or email all of that information gets sent to me, as your Nominating Committee Chair; Claire Mikko, Governor and Susan Harbin, ECR.

So, starting now, the Nominating Committee will be getting down to business. Your District Nominating Committee is Sherill Casey-Bakai, Laurie Kaye, Jo Reid and myself. We will then verify nominations by checking the references listed and notifying the candidate of the status of their nomination. The information regarding the qualifications, the qualification form and the duties of each office is available on the Florida District website (www.pilotflorida.org) under the PILOT tab at District Nomination Information.

If you have any questions, please feel free to contact any member of the Nominating Committee. I look forward to receiving all of your nominations!

From Mentored to Mended for Leadership

- **Skill Assessment:** Identify each member's strengths (organization, communication, creativity, outreach) and match them with officer roles that fit.
- **Leadership Shadowing:** Pair members with current officers so they can observe responsibilities firsthand—like running meetings, managing projects, or handling finances.
- **Gradual Responsibility:** Start with small tasks (chairing a committee, leading a project) before moving into officer positions. This builds confidence without overwhelming them.
- **Training & Resources:** Offer workshops or guides on parliamentary procedure, budgeting, event planning, and community outreach—so they feel equipped for higher office.
- **Encouragement & Recognition:** Publicly acknowledge their growth. Recognition motivates members to step into leadership roles.
- **Pathway to Higher Roles:** Once they succeed locally, encourage them to consider district or international positions, showing how their impact can expand beyond the club.

Why This Matters

By “mending” members into officer positions, you’re not just filling roles—you’re creating a sustainable leadership pipeline. It ensures continuity, revitalization, and keeps the club vibrant with fresh ideas while honoring tradition.

- Project Coordinator and Fundraiser Coordinator keep the members updated as needed on future events, deadlines, details, etc.?
- Text timely reminders to members (close deadlines, upcoming event date, etc.)?
- Contact prospective members? It can certainly take more than one call to encourage someone to attend your meeting.
- Follow-up on guests who have attended? Did they have questions? Are they interested in attending another meeting?
- MENTOR new members? Review your recent meeting's discussion to answer questions? There is a lot for a new member to learn.

All members – not just Officers and Appointees -- should make a habit of reviewing emails and texts daily and responding. Stay involved in YOUR club!
