Galatians 3: 26-29

For in Christ Jesus you are all children of God through faith. As many of you as were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ. There is no longer Jew or Greek, there is no longer slave or free, there is no longer male and female; for all of you are one in Christ Jesus. And if you belong to Christ, then you are Abraham's offspring, heirs according to the promise.

Ephesians 4: 1-6 (Unity in the Body of Christ)

I therefore, the prisoner in the Lord, beg you to lead a life worthy of the calling to which you have been called, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, making every effort to maintain the unity of the Spirit, in the bond of peace. There is one body and one Spirit, just as

you were called to the one hope of your calling, one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all, who is above all and through all and in all.

The Agape Feast

Here before us, you will find some water and bread. It is important to know that this feast is not a Eucharistic feast (the Sacrament of Holy Communion), but a feast of love and fellowship. Let us commemorate our unity through Christ and feast on the Spirit of love who is Christ.

The meal is shared with plates of bread, muffins, bagels, crackers, or something similar. The Loving Cup is shared with water, tea, juice, or coffee. Offer this blessing (either spoken or sung):

**Be present at our table, Lord;
Be here and everywhere adored;
Thy creatures bless, and grant that we
May feast in paradise with Thee.**

Offer these words of Scripture to one another:

“You satisfy the thirsty and fill the hungry with good things” (Psalm 107:9).

“Jesus said, ‘I am the bread of life. The one who comes to me will never go hungry, and the one who believes in me will never be thirsty’” (John 6:35).

Responses to God's grace and goodness are invited in a time of sharing. This could include practical responses to the needs of the world through service, giving, and prayer.
