2 ROADS TO RECYCLING

Traditional Recycling

Nearly half of private sector fraud cases involve someone in the organization!

Documents are disposed in open recycling bins or wastebaskets. Confidential documents can sit unsecured!



Cleaning crew empties bins. Material may be left clear plastic bags or dumped into unlocked outdoor recycling bins, leaving information visible and vulnerable.



Material from the bins is collected in a truck for transport to a sorting facility. Vehicles may be open to the wind, allowing intact documents to blow away.



Documents are eventually sorted by un-vetted staff for recycling.



Finally, the documents are destroyed at the paper mill during the re-pulping process.

No guaranteed destruction time or record of destruction

Your effort to recycle is good for the environment, but did your information get exposed during the process?

Secure Document Destruction

Infoshred provides a variety of sizes of secure tamper-proof collection containers.

Documents disposed through a slot in locked consoles or bins.



Locked consoles/ bins are collected by carefully vetted, badge-identified, uniformed Infoshred employees.



Locked bins are transported in GPS tracked trucks to our secure facility to be destroyed, or directly emptied into our mobile shredding unit to be destroyed on-site



24 Hrs



Material from consoles/bins is emptied into the shredder, shredded & baled within 24 hours of arrival at our NAID certified facility.



Bales of shredded paper are sent to the paper mill for de-inking and re-pulping.

A Certificate of Destruction is issued
