# Legislative Coffees And School Finances

## **School Finance 101/School Audit**

To better inform our patrons in the district about school finances, I will begin this month and every month moving forward with a new section called "School Finance 101."

This will also be an on-going agenda item at all of our school board meetings beginning in January.

Each South Dakota public school district is required by law to have an independent financial/compliance audit performed at least every two years. The Yankton School District chooses to have an audit conducted annually to ensure compliance with finance-related legal and contractual provisions and to ensure accurate and timely filing of financial reports with appropriate state and federal agencies.

The objective of an audit is to enable the auditor to express an opinion as to whether the financial statements are prepared, in all material respects, in accordance with generally accepted accounting standards. An audit opinion is given on whether the financial statements give a true and fair view of the entity's financial position and are free from material misstatement. Audits also serve as a test on internal controls and fraud detection.

The YSD is one of only two school districts in South Dakota that prepares a Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR) and has received the Certificate of Excellence in Financial Reporting from the Association of School Business Officials International for 15 consecutive years and has once again applied for this prestigious recognition for fiscal year ended June 30, 2018.

A CAFR provides school board members and other stakeholders with information about the school's operations and management that goes beyond financial statements by adding a statistical section, supplemental narratives and various charts and graphs to the audit report. In addition, the CAFR is filed with credit rating agencies and the Securities Exchange Commission for annual financial disclosure compliance for bonds and other financing.

The Boys and Girls Club is divided into three different areas to accommodate elementary, middle school and high school students respectively. Each area is separated and supervised independently from each other, along with separated entrances as well.

Both middle school and high school students are also welcome to attend the Boys and Girls Club. It is a safe and warm place for all students to get their homework done, have a snack, play games, and socialize around other students. ### **Yankton School District Tuition-Free Preschool**

These children need to be 3 or 4 by Sept. 1, 2019. There is a \$50 registration fee upon registering, which will be refunded upon enrolling in the district's JrK or Kindergarten the following years.

### **Stand Up For School Safety Program**

The Yankton School District is participating in the Stand Up For School Safety Program sponsored by the State of South Dakota, which is an anonymous texting platform to promote the reporting of suspicious behavior, threats or violence.

Anonymous users answer a series of eight questions, including what kind of threat exists and where the threat is located. This information is immediately sent by email to Dr. Kindle and local law enforcement officials. They work together to assess and address the concern brought forward.

Parents, Students, and Community members are encouraged to anonymously text "Safe" to 82257 in reporting suspicious behavior, threats or violence.

### **Road Conditions**

During the winter months we will experience many days with snow packed and slippery roads, along with blowing snow. We will have school on these days, unless we are in some type of weather warning.
