## **School Board Agenda - Public Request for Agenda Item**

The Yankton School District welcomes public input and request for an agenda item. In last month's edition of the Kindle's Korner, information was provided to the public regarding public input. This month we take a closer look at agenda items pertaining to the public.

Requests to place items on the agenda: Requests for items to be placed on the agenda shall be submitted in writing to the superintendent no later than five business days prior to the scheduled Board meeting. The request shall state the name and address of the individual or group submitting the request, the precise topic to be addressed, and the specific purpose for the request. A form for the purpose of requesting an item be placed on the agenda is available at the District office or on the District website and must be used to make a request.

The superintendent will confer with the president of the Board concerning approval to place the requested item on the agenda. The president makes the ultimate decision regarding agenda items, but items may not be excluded due to the viewpoint of the speaker, or due to the subject matter proposed except as provided in this policy. All agenda items must address a matter directly related to Yankton Public Schools. The Board will not permit in public session any complaints about school personnel, a student or any person connected with the District. Persons with complaints regarding individuals will be directed to the Board policy regarding the proper procedure for such complaints. If the proposed agenda item is not directly related to the Yankton Public Schools or relates to a student or personnel issue, it will not be placed on the agenda.

The requesting party will be advised of the meeting at which the item will be part of the agenda.
