FROM THE PRINCIPAL:

Dear Parents,

The Georgia Milestones End of Grade (EOG) Test is around the corner for our third, fourth and fifth grade students. Preparation for this comprehensive assessment takes place all year within our classrooms through a rigorous academic program. Our Buccaneers are ready!

The testing schedule is seven days for fifth graders and five days for third and fourth graders and is as follows:

Thursday, April 20	3, 4, 5	English Language Arts Section 2

Monday, April 24	3, 4, 5	Math Section 1	
Tuesday, April 25	3, 4, 5	Math Section 2	
Wednesday, April 25	5	Science Sections 1 & 2	
Thursday, April 27	5	Social Studies Sections 1 & 2	

Testing days often require a schedule change, so all Mt. Bethel students may have a different lunch/specials time during the testing window to accommodate required windows of time for test administration.

Some interesting features of the Milestones EOG Test:

- Math includes multiple select questions that allow for more than one correct answer.
- English Language Arts includes evidence-based selected response items which require two part answers. The first part answers
 an inferential or key concept question related to the text. The second part is evidence from the text used to support the
 inference or idea.

The best way you can help your student be ready for testing is to send them to school well-rested, full from a good breakfast, and in a good frame of mind after a stress-free morning! We will ask teachers to decrease or eliminate homework during the testing window, as well.

Thank you for your continued support. Don't hesitate to reach out to one of our testing coordinators via email if you have any questions regarding the Milestones.

Meet and Greet - 2 chairs - Plan the room layout, schedule, and volunteers for Back to School Meet and Greet. One day event the week before school starts. Work with presale, treasurer, and PTA executive board to coordinate details.

Legislative - 2 chairs - Monitor issues and keep parents/school community informed about local, state, & national issues that concern our children. Attend PTA Day at the Capitol and PTA Advocacy Conference Day.

East Cobb Parade - 1 chair - Register for parade, arrange for vehicles to drive MBES staff, and purchase candy. One day event in the fall (usually September).

Cultural Celebrations - 1 co-chair - Plan and set up exhibits representing various cultural events and activities from around the world.

Fun Run Fair - 1 co-chair - Set-up and coordinate Fun Run Fair, typically the first Saturday in November. Coordinate vendors and volunteers, plan decorations, set-up, tear down day of race.

Book Fair - 2 co-chairs - Schedule, promote, plan decorations, set-up, tear down and/or packet distribution for Fall & Spring Book Fairs.

Literacy/Read Across America - 1 co-chair - Promote literacy in our school and other schools through a variety of events, including Book Swap and Read Across America. Read Across America usually early March. Book Swap event usually late April. Additional events/activities may be added to meet literacy goals.

Spring Thing - 1 co-chair - Oversee/plan food, decorations, entertainment, set-up, and clean-up for this fun, family event held in the Spring,.

Visiting Author - 1 co-chair - Plan and coordinate the Visiting Author event and book sale.

Yearbook - 1 co-chair - Oversee the production of the Mt. Bethel yearbook. Take candid pictures throughout the year in the classrooms and at school events. Layout/editing of yearbook pages and distribution in the Spring.

Fall Fundraiser - 1 co-chair - Implement/promote the Read-A-Thon PTA fall fundraiser. This fundraiser focuses on reading. Nearly 95% of all proceeds go back to the Mt Bethel PTA to help fund school programs.

Family Fun Night - 2 chairs - Plan/organize this fun family event in the Fall; coordinate volunteers and activities.

Reflections - 1 co-chair - National PTA Art Contest held in the Fall with a celebration ceremony for all participants in the Winter; promote the program to students, organize/process entries, and plan ceremony.

Rising 1st – 6th Grade Mt. Bethel Students





We have begun completing our first round of coding challenges for **fifth grade**, please ask your child how Ozobots code through color!

The PTA has provided us with more Legos and new ZOOB builders, **K-3** have been enjoying fun and challenging engineering challenges.

4th grade recently discovered just how small Earth is compared to the Universe. They completed a relative size model of the sun and other planets, all based on if the Earth was the size of a marble. They enjoyed converting planet size all the way down to the mm!

TECHNOLOGY:

Kindergarten: In the month of February, the Kindergarteners enjoyed the book, <u>When I Grow Up</u> by Al Yankovic. We discussed the jobs they currently have at school and at home and how these jobs/chores help prepare them for the responsibilities they will have in their grown up careers. The 2nd lesson of the month was focused on safety and strangers. We watched The Berenstain Bears <u>Learn about Strangers</u> and did a safety worksheet.

First Grade: The focus with first graders has been on responsibility and careers. For the responsibility lesson, we played responsibility basketball. Students were asked to answer questions giving a responsible choice and then had a chance to shoot a basket. During the game students were asked to use good sportsmanship and encourage their teammates and opponents. We read Curious George Takes a Job and talked about the different tools that are used for jobs. This lesson is designed to increase student knowledge of different jobs available and tools needed for those jobs. We also spent time talking about the importance of thinking about interests and skills when considering a future career.

Second Grade: In the 2nd grade we read the delightful book, <u>Somebody Loves You Mr. Hatch</u> by Eileen Spinelli. We discussed the importance of kindness and showing people that you care about them. The students were encouraged to think of a specific act of kindness they could do that week for a friend or family member. They were then asked to write it down and draw a picture of what they planned to do. At the end of February we played a game called Quickthink, in which I read different scenarios and the students were to say whether the situation was safe/unsafe and why. The scenarios ranged from strangers, to fires, guns and medicine.

Third Grade: Third graders listened to a story about a girl named Jana, who was not responsible with her time which prevented her from getting her homework done. This also prevented her from spending time with her friends. Instead of taking responsibility, Jana made excuses. We talked about how to take responsibility for the choices we make instead of making excuses. In third grade the students are encouraged to think about jobs that could match their interests and skills. We discussed that often our interests change or develop as we get older and this can influence our career choice. Students were encouraged to think of careers that currently match their interests.

Fourth Grade: In the 4th grade, we discussed the reasons people tease (including attention, power, insecurity, need for belonging, revenge) and the hurtful impact of teasing. We did a matching worksheet to review the material they were taught.

Fifth Grade: This month fifth grade focused on working cooperatively as a team. They were given the task of making the connection between how they participate on teams currently and what will be necessary to foster positive team relationships in their future careers. Together we brainstormed the different teams they currently participate on because they are all a part of some team. The long list varied from their team at home with their families, the fifth grade team, the Bucket Filing Brigade, sports teams, boys/girls scouts, etc. They were all reminded that teamwork is when a group of people work together to meet a common goal. Each student was then given the task of identifying qualities they would want in their teammate as well as what type of teammate they desire to be. To wrap things up, students worked together as a team to build a pyramid using only plastic cups, rubber bands, and pipe cleaners. The one rule was that every team member must participate. This activity required the students to exercise patience, encourage others, and muster up a great deal of resilience. After the activity, we reflected on the glows/grows!

Kindergarten Camp: June 5 - 8!


