

Name that Herbicide Family

The two pictures below are examples of symptomology of a specific group of herbicides that are labeled for grass control in almost every crop and situation imaginable. When applied they are translocated to the most active point of cell division or growth, in this case the center tiller of these rice plants. While there are herbicides from this group labeled in rice, this one is not and this mistake will likely ruin this field. The center tiller will typically pull freely away from the plant and this is often referred to as “rotten neck”.
