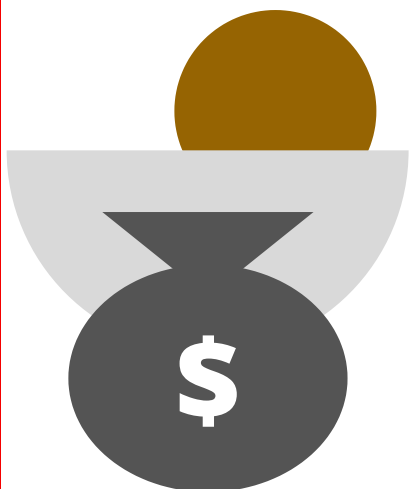
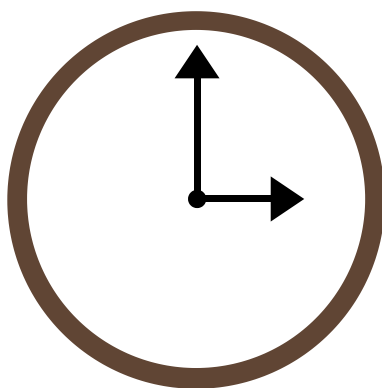
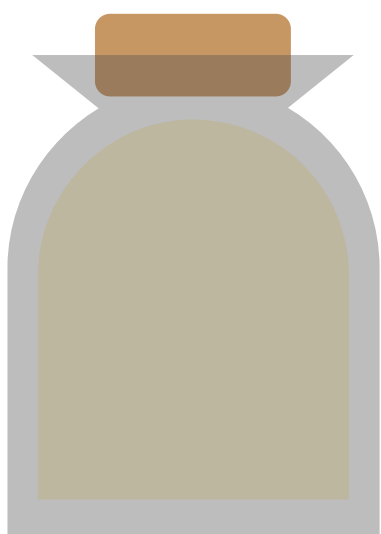
Holy Week begins with Palm Sunday.

Many churches bless palms at the start of worship on Palm Sunday. Each person gets a palm leaf to wave like the people did in Jesus' time.

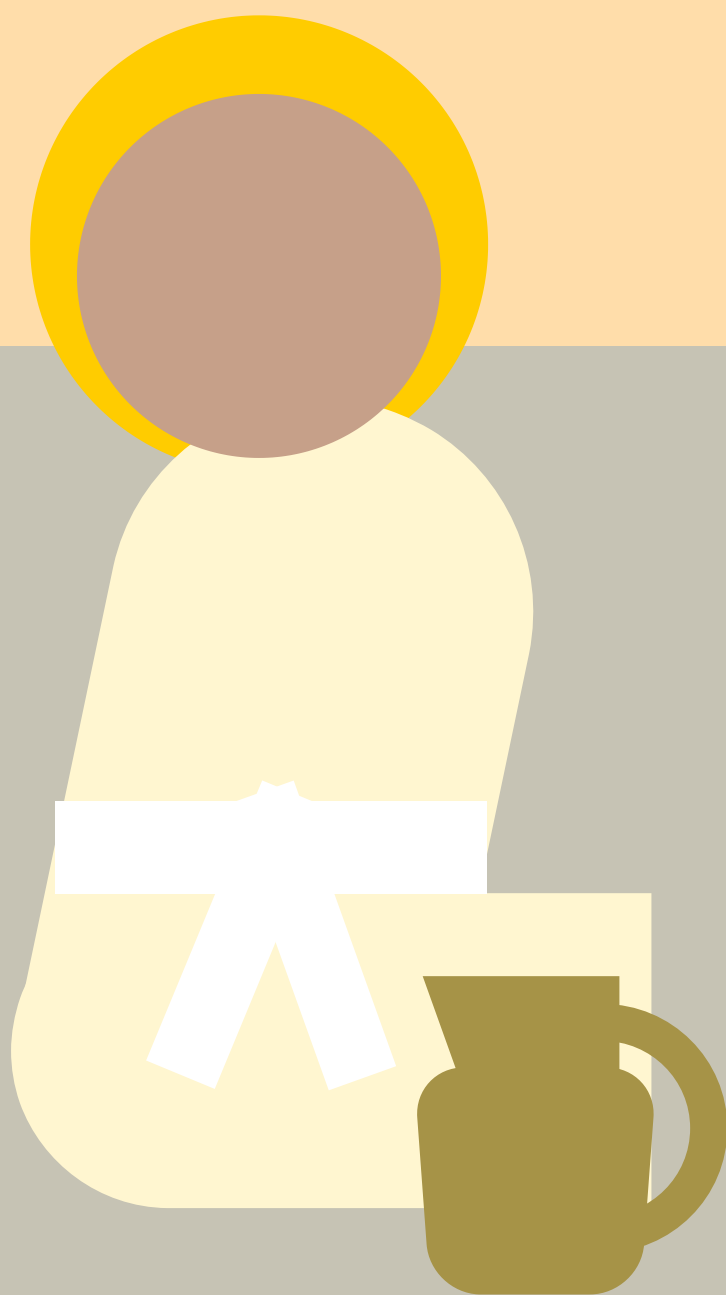
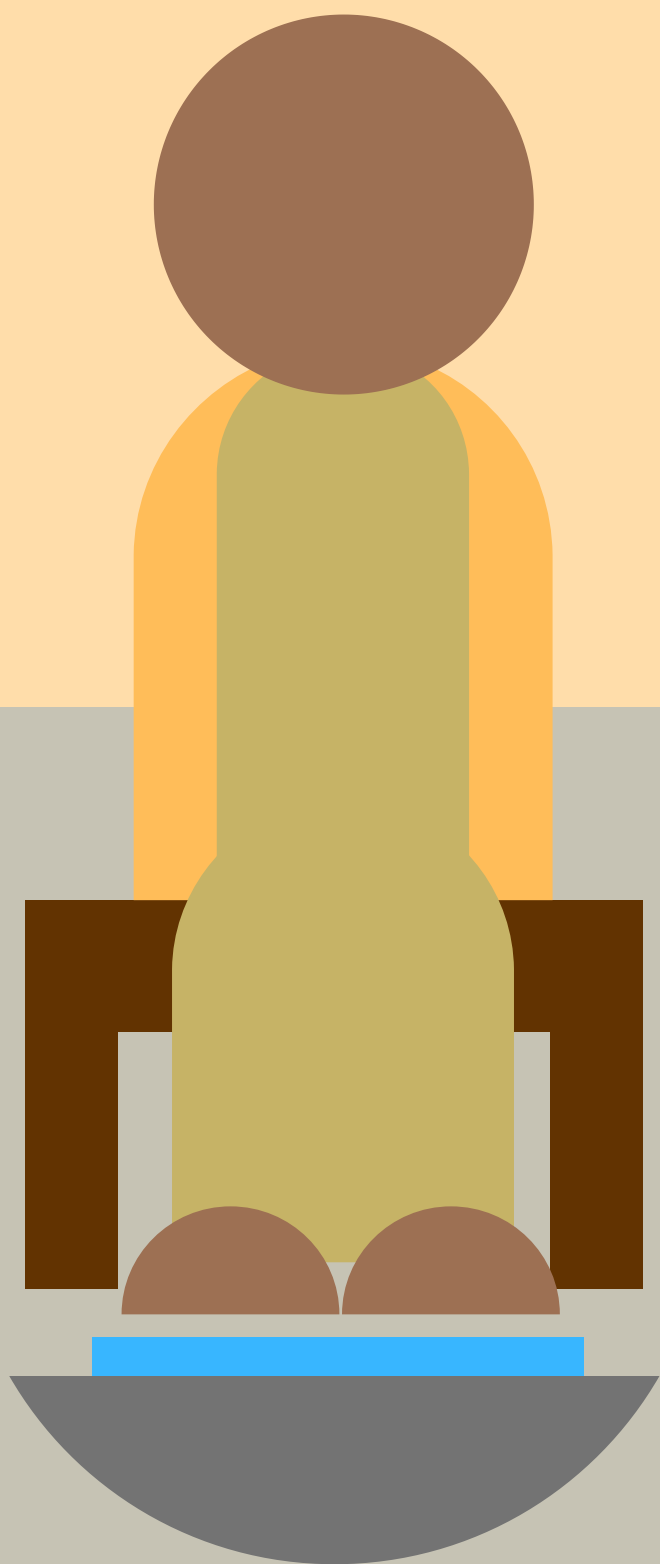
What is the word of praise that they shouted at Jesus?

On Wednesday, we hear the story of how Judas chooses to betray Jesus for money. Jesus knows that this will happen.



We call the Thursday of Holy Week,
Maundy Thursday, because Jesus gave the
disciples a new commandment, or a new
way to live their lives.

On this day, we remember when Jesus
spent one last night with his friends.

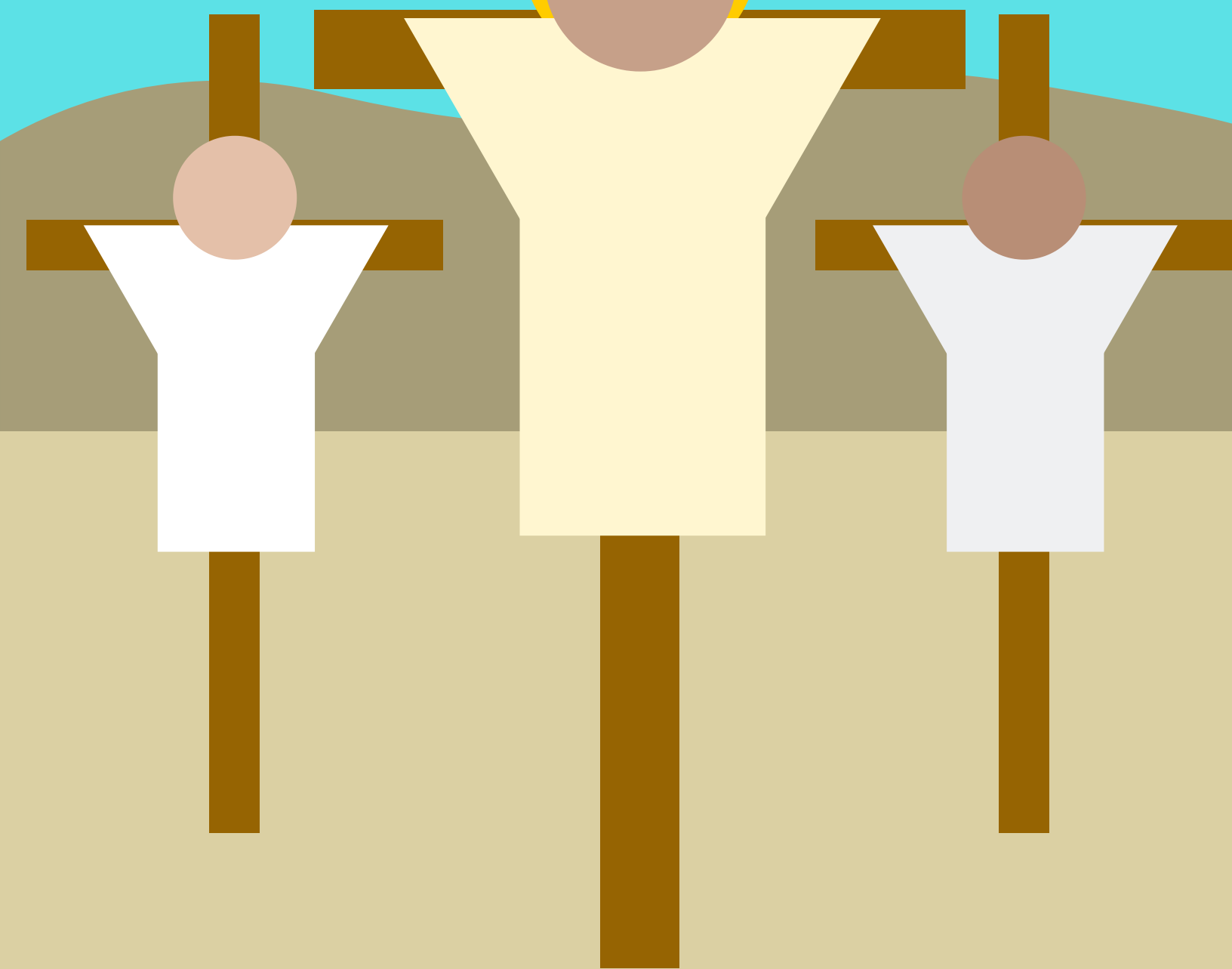
Jesus served his disciples by washing their

the same for others.



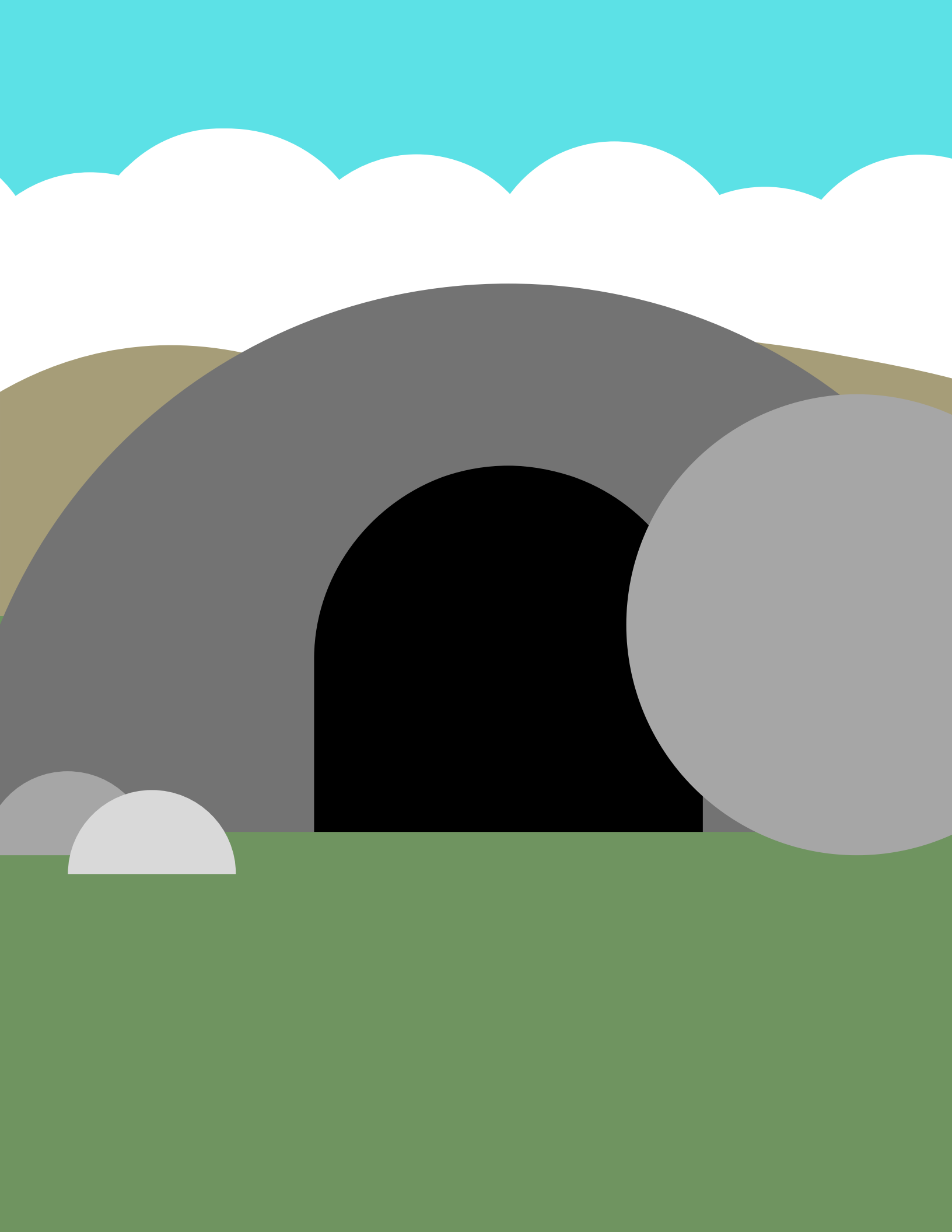
On this day, Jesus also ate one last meal with the disciples. He broke bread and shared wine with them. He asked his disciples to remember him whenever they break bread and share wine together.

Does this remind you of something that we do at church?

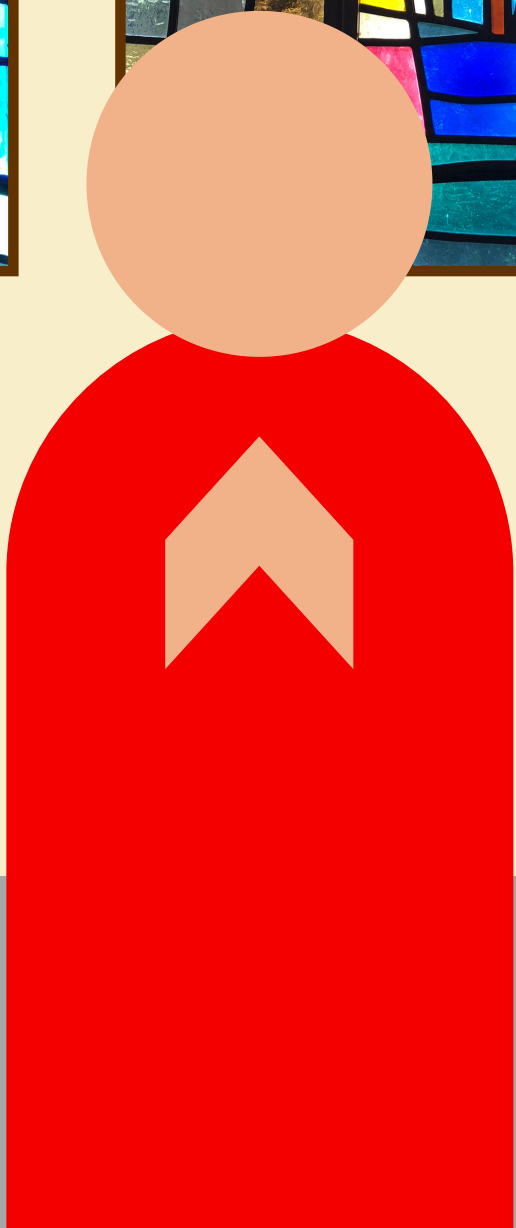
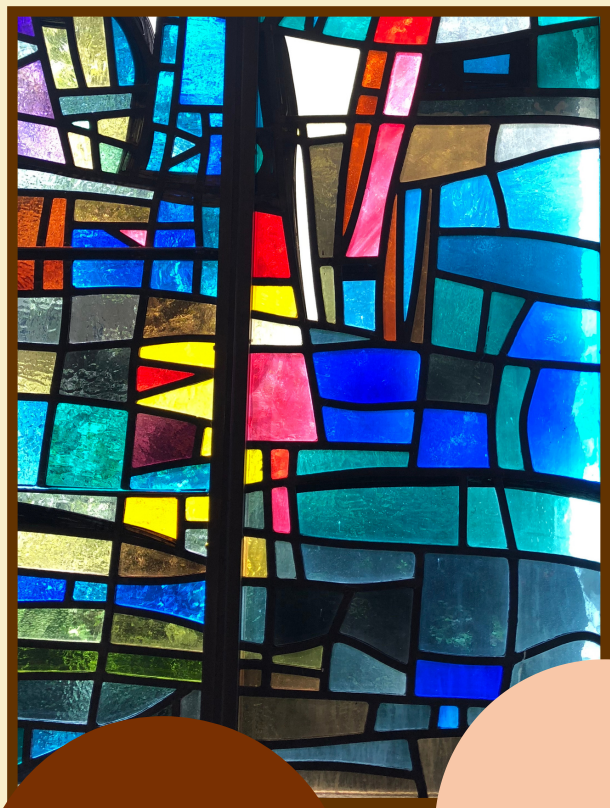
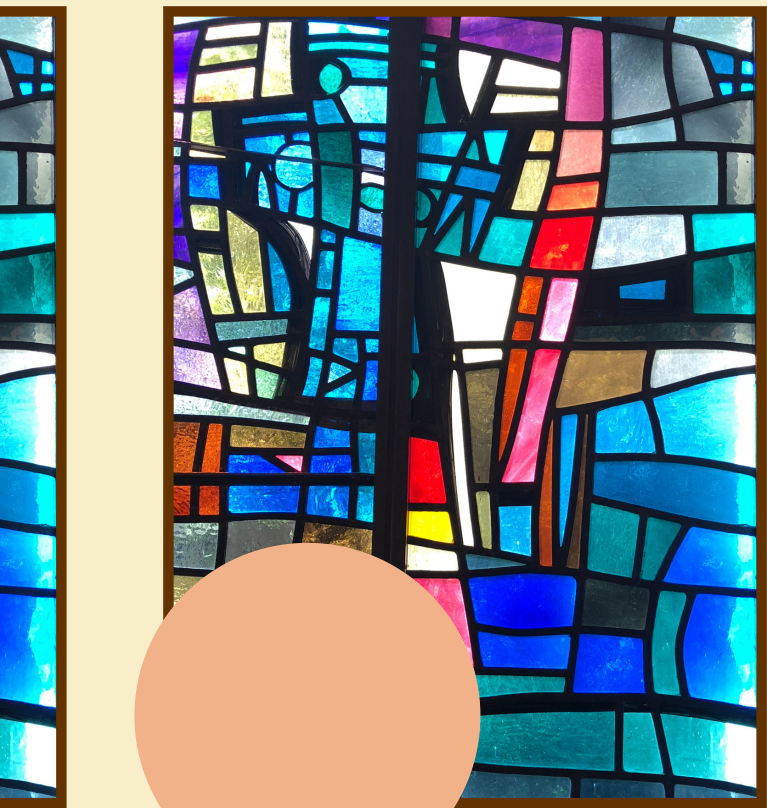
King of the Jews
