



And the LORD spoke to Moses, saying, "Speak to the children of Israel, and say to them: 'The feasts of the LORD, which you shall proclaim to be holy convocations, these are My feasts.'"

Leviticus 23:1-2

The feasts begin at sunset the night *before* the date shown, except Passover, which begins at twilight on the date shown.

- Purim: Tuesday, March 3
- Pesach/Passover: Wednesday, April 1
- Feast of Unleavened Bread (Day 1): Thursday, April 2
- Feast of Unleavened Bread (Day 7): Wednesday, April 8
- First Fruits: Sunday, April 5
- Counting of the Omer: April 5-May 24
- Shavuot/Pentecost/Feast of Weeks: Sunday, May 24
- Yom Teruah/Feast of Trumpets: Saturday, September 12
- Yom Kippur/Day of Atonement: Monday, September 21
- Sukkot/Feast of Tabernacles (Day 1): Saturday, September 26
- Sukkot/Feast of Tabernacles (Day 8): Saturday, October 3
- Hanukkah: Saturday, Dec. 5 Saturday, Dec. 12
